CHOCOLATE FESTIVAL

Columbus brought chocolate to Spain in 1502 after his fourth voyage to the New World. Chocolate is made from beans native to tropical America. Columbus' bitter cocoa beans received an indifferent reception in the Old World. After tasting chocolate paste and drinks prepared by the Aztecs in 1519, Hemando Cortez brought more cocoa beans to Spain with the knowledge of how to prepare them.

The resulting chocolate concoction was well received in Spain. The country enjoyed a chocolate monopoly for nearly a century. Chocolate was not fully accepted in France until new French queens from Spain adopted chocolate as the official drink of the French court in the 16th Century.


