The above time and place is where you can go to have your fire extinguisher checked and tagged for the 1992 season. The minimum cost is \$3 for just a check and tag. The maximum charge for work on your extinguisher (including a complete fill) is \$15.

We have a list compiled of participants with non-current fire extinguishers. If you have not have not had your extinguisher updated by 12:00 PM NOON, on Saturday, your booth can be shut down. This is in keeping with Shopkeepers Rules and Regulations:

"Each Structure must have a fully charged, 5lb. ABC underwriter licensed fire extinguisher. The extinguisher should be easily accessible at all times and be maintained in operating condition. A service tag should indicate that the fire extinguisher has been ehecked and serviced annually. Lost extinguishers or those not in working order must be replaced within 24 Hours of notification by Festival Staff."

LIFE IN THE CAMPGROUND CONTINUED

tertainers, games, and CKC participants. We'll see you there!


