
#### COME AND GET IT!

We at the Hall of Scribes are very close to our neighbors in Wind Rose mill ~ in fact, our buildings are conjoined at the Water Wheel Some of you (and most Festival patrons) may think we are one shop, but the truth is, we are separate operations of crafts which are closely related. The running of the paper operation changed hands a couple of years ago. Now in its 3rd year, Jeff. Morgan, and Deb are fine tuning and expanding their their demonstrations and retail area. They are giving "in character" demos of paper—making, marbling paper, and book binding. Patrons may receive a scheduled demo tour of the Mill several times each day. They can even have a hands on opportunity to make paper.

The inside of their building has changed recently. Some walls were torn down, a second story was added and, unfortunately, some machinery that was once operated by the tempermental water wheel had to be removed.

Our neighbors have worked very hard to build their business in Wind Rose Mill. If you haven't visited them yet, consider checking them out. They are your neighbors, too.


