CLEAN UP YOUR GARBAGE! It's the end of the season, and with everything else you have to pack, garbage may be the last thing you want to think about. Campers in the Campground: You will NOT receive your \$10.00 deposit back if your campsite is a mess. Please cleanup your bottles, cans, garbage, etc. Booth owners: Clean out your booth before you leave! Aside from garbage drawing all kinds of critters, opening a booth next summer with the scent of rotting garbage, etc wafting out ain't pretty! SO **CLEAN UP!!**

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Camping at Festival, 1994

Here they are. The groovy rules and regulations for participant camping at Festival in 1994. Pay close attention and **SAVE THIS NEWSLETTER** so you can answer your own camping questions next season.

Camping Reservation Policies for 1994

1. Beginning July 1st, 1994, reservations for campground space may be made by mailing your request to Campground Reservations, c/o the Festival office. Reservations will **NOT** be accepted if postmarked before July first. **NO PHONE CALLS WILL BE ACCEPTED!** You must provide your name, address, phone number and what you are bringing in (tent, trailer, RV, Van, etc.) Send your \$20 with your reservation. The check or money order will be cashed upon you claiming your space.
2. Any space so reserved must be occupied no later than noon on Friday, August 12th.
3. Phone reservations end as of noon on Friday, August 12th, and any remaining space will be assigned on a first come, first served basis.
4. Campground electrical hook-up may be reserved by paying the appropriate fee.

Proposed Campground Rules, 1994

I. Opening and Closing

- A. The campground will open July 30th, 1994, at 8:00am. Nothing will be set up in the campground prior to that date without permission from Campground Director or Festival Management.
- B. The campground will close on October 3rd at noon. Anything left in the campground at the time will be considered abandoned property.

II. Eligibility

- A. The campground is for MRF personnel only! You must have a valid MRF pass on your person at all times while in the campground.
- B. You must be 18 years old or older. Anyone under 18 must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian.
- C. The various MRF departments (Personnel, CKC, Entertainment) may impose additional requirements, or grant exemptions as they see fit.

III. Registration

- A. Anyone wishing to set-up in the campground must check in with the campground director First.
- B. Any tent, trailer, R.V., etc. which is to be set-up or parked in the campground must be registered with the Campground Director, and display appropriate proof of registration.

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C. To register, you must possess a valid photo or generic ID, and meet one of the following requirements:

1. You must live 30 or miles away from the site, or,
2. You must have been involved with the Festival for 3 or more years.

IV. Campground Fees

A. There is a \$20 fee per registration. Ten dollars will be refunded if the registered site is clean when checking out.

B. There is a \$100.00 electrical hook-up fee. Campground electric is governed by the area site regulations.

C. The showers cost 25 cents per minute and a half.

V. Parking

A. Any vehicle which is parked in the campground must display the appropriate tag. Motorcycles and RV's and Vans which are registered with the Campground Director are exempt from this rule.

B. Campground parking tags are issued only to those who have a physical disability or who make special application to the Campground director.

C. Any vehicle parked in the campground which does not display the appropriate tag, is in a designated "no parking" area, or is parked in an un-safe manner, may be towed without notice at owner's expense.

VI. General Regulations

A. 10:30pm to 6:00am is designated Quiet Time. Loud noise and behavior will not be tolerated.

B. Fire pits must be approved by the Campground Director before being used. An "A" rated fire-extinguisher or a five gallon bucket filled with water must be nearby while a fire is going. Fires may not be left burning unattended. All open fires may be prohibited depending upon weather conditions.

C. Dogs must leashed at all times and must be registered with the Festival office. Animals which show signs of abuse or neglect will be taken to the nearest animal shelter.

D. Any action which violates Federal, State, or local laws will be considered cause for immediate expulsion from the campground and may result in arrest.

E. The Campground Director and MRF management reserve the right to expell from the campground anyone who violates the Campground Rules, or any other MRF policy or regulation.

F. The campground Director and MRF mangement reserve the right to modify any of these rules at anytime.
