#### HALL OF MASTERS

Thank you again for bringing us such lovely things to display! Blaine and I are certain we have two of the best positions around, because we get to handle and admire your creations.

After Saturday's ruckus, it appears to be necessary that we review our check-in or drop-off procedure. On Sunday we bring reminders to those crafters eligible to display the following weekend. The reminder is a full page sheet which is preprinted with the shop name and number and the crafter's name and status. If and when this is brought to the hall, with the item(s) for display, you need not complete an additional half page form. Those are for crafters who misplace or forget the preprinted page or who need additional pages for more pieces. This form must stay with your piece(s). We use it to identify who made what and what you would like us to call the piece! This weekend there were a pile of half pages and preprinted pages left on the long glass case and we did our best to sort out what to credit to whom. Please forgive us if we have miscredited your piece! Aside from the description page, we also need you to sign our insurance roster. If you do not sign in on the insurance roster, we cannot tell partons the approximate price when they inquire. If a piece is damaged in some way, and you have not listed a value in advance, you may not be reimbursed for the full amount you consider appropriate. Please help us keep our records accurate and current!
