EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

We hope that serious emergencies don't arise; but if they do, we all need to know what to do. Here are some guidelines to cover situations that arise:

In the event of a life-threatening situation:

- Call 911 from a pay phone. No coin needed.
- 2. Wait at the phone for
- police to arrive.
 Contact Safety Services.
 During evenings, BLT
 & Campground have radios which can contact Safety Services.

If a problem occurs during the show, contact Safety Services. They are the folks in the red and yellow costumes carrying a large pole topped with a flag. They have radio contact with paramedics and police and can also assist you with less serious problems. They are headquartered out of the building that is attached to the First Aid Station.

In the event that a major disaster occurs, we may need to evacuate the site. You will need to help direct people to the nearest way out. Safety Services will be directing and coordinating crowd control. Please assist them if called upon.

PARTICIPANT NEEDS FOR A SAFER & HEALTHIER FESTIVAL


- 1. Drink plenty of fluids -- WATER.

Minimum Code Requirements for Sleeping Areas

from the Scott County Building Inspector

Sleeping areas must be separated from other occupancies with a minimum occupancy separation of 1 hour.

Sleeping areas shall have at least one operable window or door approved for emergency escape or rescue.

Every building or usable portion thereof shall have at least one exit and shall not be less than 3' in width and 6' 8" in height.

There shall be a floor or landing at each side of a door with a minimum size of 36" x 36".

A smoke detector shall be installed in each sleeping area. Smoke detectors shall receive their primary power from the building wiring and be equipped with a battery backup. Wiring shall be permanent.

Sleeping areas shall have a floor area of not less than 70 square feet and a ceiling height of not less than 7' 6".

A building permit is required for change of use and remodeling.

Note: These are preliminary minimum requirements and are subject to changes.

A Message from Don Hamilton, Security Coordinator

Several bad checks have surfaced at the Festival this year. A good example has been several checks that had the forged signature of Philip Duarte on them. Mr. Duarte reports that his check book was stolen and the person or persons responsible were cashing them at the Festival.

When you take a person's check, make sure you ask for identification, check several ID cards, make sure that one of them is a picture ID card. Compare the picture with the person cashing the check. Take that extra step to protect yourself from suffering this loss.
