Welcome to the 2009 Minnesota Renaissance Festival. We have been anticipating the arrival of this wonderful event and now it's hard to believe it's finally here.

IMPORTANT NEWS: I wanted to let all of you know that I will be leaving Mid-America Festivals after the first weekend of the show. I just got married at the end of June and will be moving with my husband to Madison, Wisconsin. My husband has recently graduated from Chiropractic school and he will be opening a Chiropractic office in Madison. I am excited for this new path in my life but I want to wish you all good luck and a successful season. Thank You all for welcoming me into the world of Crafts. I have learned a lot during my time as the Craft Coordinator. You are a very talented group of people who have a lot offer. You have given me a new respect for Arts and Crafts.

The office has hired someone to take over my position, her name is Teresa. Teresa will be walking around with me first weekend to learn the ropes. She has only been with the company for a week. Passes: You should have either picked up or received your passes by now. If you sent in your pass and did not receive it back, it expired and you will need to get a new one taken. I have all passes that did not get picked up in a box at B-Gate for you to pickup opening weekend. If you don't have enough orange (no-site access) parking passes, the girls at B-Gate can help you. If you want to make changes to your pass list during the week call or email Teresa by no later then Wednesday. What about \$S worker passes? You will still be able to utilize that, and with the same rules that were already in place. What are those rules? Refer to your Craft Participant handbook for the deadline. What about extra passes? You can still purchase extra passes for \$56 per photo ID and \$53 per Generic. You just have to inform Teresa ahead of time.

Teresa will be selling discounted Renaissance Festival tickets that crafters may purchase. The prices this year are \$15.00 for Adults and \$8.00 for children. You may purchase these from Teresa out at B-gate during festival hours or come and see her at the office during the week.

The Craft Liaison program has once again been instituted. This program seemed to work well in the past and I hope it will continue into the future. I do want to thank all the volunteers that help with this program. They will deliver your Privy's on Saturdays and can provide you with forms for questions, comments or concerns.

Greetings from Safety Services!

Welcome back, and we hope you all have a good season. We have a few things we'd like to go over quickly.

Please make sure you have your pass at all times. Without it, you'll be asked to leave. No one is allowed on site without a pass, no one is allowed through gates without a pass, and no one is allowed after hours without a pass. Please make sure that you and any of your employees have a pass prior to coming to work; those without passes will have to go to B-Gate to obtain them, and will not be allowed to cut through site to get there.

Care on Site

Cars are not allowed to enter site after 8:00a.m, and all cars must be off site by 8:30 a.m.. This has been the rule for well over 16 years. Please do not plan on showing up at 8:45 and expect to be allowed onsite. Also, please note that, at the discretion of MAF management, cars may not be permitted on site if the ground is wet and muddy. If it rains, please plan accordingly.

Safety Services / First Aid Hours

Safety Services Staff is on duty from 6:00 p.m. Friday evenings until 2:00 a.m. Monday mornings,

Another Fine Mess! Some thoughts from Carr Hagerman

It's been a tough year for nearly everyone I know, and I include myself in that class. The economy has been like a belligerent drunk, and while some say the recession is over, the hangover is likely to be a real humdinger. There have been times when it seems our country is coming undone at the changes and stumbling over the mess. Woodrow Wilson wrote, "If you want to make enemies, try to change something." Boy oh boy, how right he was.

I am fundamentally an optimistic person (I have my down moments, too) and believe that we are in exciting new times. As a writer and an artist I don't think I'm a enemy to change, but have discovered my own resistance and inflexibility, and recognize how easy it is to remain fixated on what's "normal." But art isn't about the status quo, and being an artist isn't about protecting the norm. Ultimately, art is about resistance, and at times of great resistance and chaos, art seems to flourish.

I've opted to reset my approach a bit by challenging some old paradigms. Rather than seeing the festival as a dusty old dump or the Land of Misfit Toys, I want to build on the idea that it is real theater, that we practice an artful form, and not just a playground for people that love Anglo-history and fantasy. Our performances are a way of turning human interactions and ideas into artful expression. Connecting and engaging with another human being in an interesting, provocative and playful manner, is an act of an artist.

When someone is watching us perform, or participating with us, we are using our judgment and experience to create a kind of living artistic moment through a dynamic relationship to audience and the environment. We are reaching out and building a bridge to another human being. When that connection isn't manufactured, scripted, or overly calculated, it is real, and that is a quality that our audience can experience as a simple form of art. Engagement, as it turns out, is the core of artistic expression because as a member of the audience, when we are engaged and pulled into the performance, we take something away from it, something that touched us, made us laugh, or think or reconsider ourselves in the world.

What people seem to want most, in these rough and tumble times, is a sense of certainty and optimism. They want to know that the world isn't falling apart, that we're all going to be okay. Art has always provided an answer because it's about finding form in chaos or celebrating the chaos itself. It allows us, as artists, to revel in our humanness, to see the uncertainty and the hurly-burly as an invitation to explore the edges and dance at the fringe. In the end, the messiness isn't something separate from us, it is us.

So as we open the season for another year, be mindful of what our customers have been through, and smile, dance, sing and celebrate because we know that everything is as it should be, and low and behold, we're all going to be just fine.
