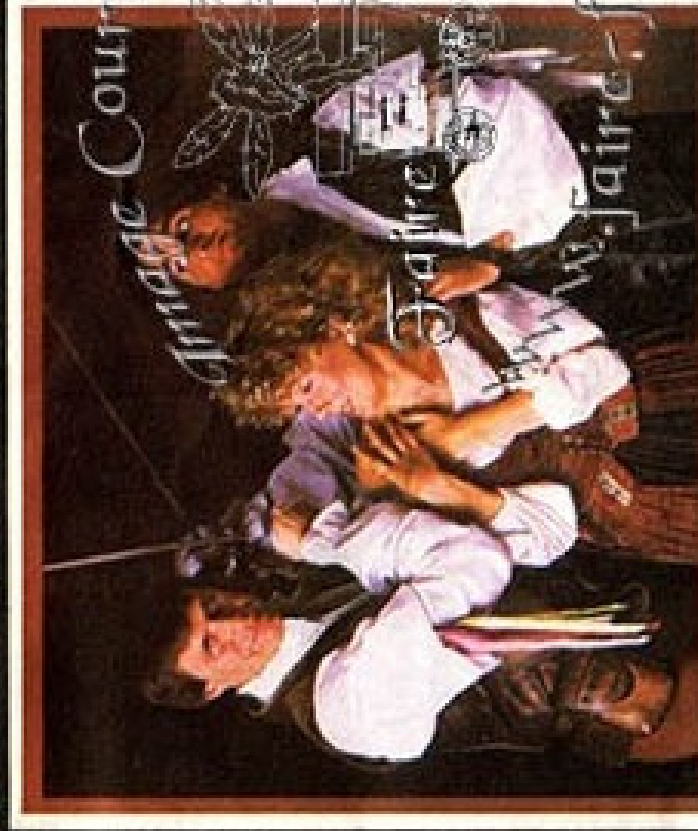

Human Chess Each day at noon the ancient game of chess becomes the backdrop for a spirited contest of strategy and wit. Peasants and nobles of the Realm assume the roles of pawns, rooks, knights and bishops while the audience joins in with rousing cheers, clever insults and laughter.

Grande Marche At 1:30 the cannon roars, the trumpets blast and the bagpipe sounds, signifying the start of the Grande Marche Parade. Their Royal Majesties lead a regal procession of village inhabitants who dance, sing, display wares, and welcome visitors to the Festival. 'Tis a spectacle not to be missed.

The Renaissance Festival proudly presents the Art of Falconry as practiced by Master Falconer and

Raptor Rehabilitator John Karger.

Falconry is one of the oldest sports of the world. It was practiced by Asians as early as 400 B.C. During the Renaissance, falconry was enjoyed by almost all classes of people. The prince and baron valued the falcon, while the yeoman and burghers set almost equal store by the less aristocratic goshawk. Even the serf was expected to train and carry the humble but graceful Kestrel hawk.

As caretaker of the Royal mews and trainer of the King's Birds of Prey, Master Karger will demonstrate his expertise in the training and care of falcons, owls, hawks, eagles and vultures.

Flying demonstrations will be held at 11:00, 1:00, 3:00 and 5:00.

Mr. Karger performs under the auspices of Last Chance Forever, San Antonio, Texas, a non-profit organization dedicated to raptor rehabilitation. All proceeds from his performances are used in programs that aid sick, orphaned and injured birds. The home of our Feast of Fantasy is called Bad Manor. The building was designed by staff designer Paul Sannerud and historic consultant David Christofferson.

The Manor includes many of the components found in a 16th Century dwelling; a central roof opening for smoke dispersal, an upper room for musicians, a jutting second story, and numerous small balconies. We hope you enjoy this excellent example of English traditional architecture.

Take an informative tour at the PENWHEEL PRESS, where demonstrations in 16th Century papermaking, printmaking, calligraphy and printing are given.

At WIND ROSE MILL, papermakers prepare the pulp and press the fibers for fine rag paper.

At the SCRIPTORIUM lessons in calligraphy, the Art of Beautiful Writing, are free to the public. View the professional scribes as they produce hand-lettered manuscripts and illuminate the printed page.

A new feature this year is a **wooden printing press** created by Richard Hicks after the design of German inventor Johannes Gutenberg. This press is a link to an age of simplicity and individuality, and a recreation of an invention important to the development of the Renaissance period.

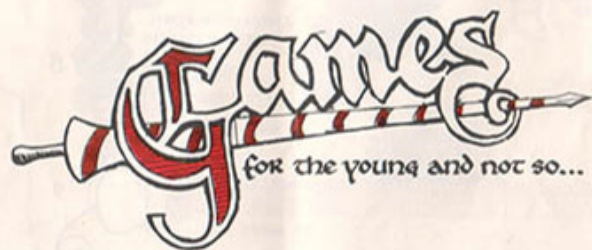
With the introduction of this invention and movable type, all the knowledge and philosophy of mankind, especially the Bible, was suddenly available to the masses.

View the working demonstrations of the press in the recreated 16th CENTURY PRINTING STUDIO.



King Henry has decreed that a chapel be built in the Festival Village. The Royal Architect has posted plans on the trestle board for all to see, and the most talented carpenters have been assembled to fit the timbers to form the chapel structure. Only hand tools will be used.
