CELESTIAL CIRCUS in the ZODIAC PAVILLION
 Visit the largest Renaissance-style pavillion tent in North America. Here Celestial Circus provides a truly unique look at astronomy, astrology, and amusement.

View their entertaining re-enactment of the great debate between the Capernican and Ptolemaic theories of the Universe; is the Earth the center of the Universe, or is the Sun? The Zodiac Pavillion, a sort of "Renaissance Planetarium," illustrates both theories in a fascinating and simple manner.

Students of the two schools of thought will be on hand every day to answer questions and show interested visitors how to use the Zodiac Pavillion.

Witness the incredible spectacle of birds of prey in flight. Master Falconer and Raptor Rehabilitator Sir John Karger demonstrates his expertise

in the training and care of falcons, owls, hawks, eagles, and vultures. Sir John performs under the auspices of Last Chance Forever, San Antonio, Texas, a non-profit organization dedicated to raptor rehabilitation. All proceeds from his performances are used in programs that aid sick, orphaned, and injured birds. COMBAT CHESS

Each day at noon the game of chess comes to life as the peasants and nobles of the realm assume the roles of pawns, rooks, bishops, and kings. As the chessmasters pit their skills against each other the players on the board erupt into hand-to-hand combat and the audience joins in with rousing cheers, clever insults and laughter.

GRANDE MARCHE At 1:30 the cannon roars, the trumpets blast and the bagpipe sounds, signifying the start of the Grande Marche Parade. Their Royal Majesties lead a colorful procession of village inhabitants who dance, sing, display wares, and welcome visitors to the Festival. 'Tis a spectacle not to be missed.

IMPORTED WINES

NON-ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

So that everyone may toast the day the Court has decreed that special drink be fermented. Enjoy wines which feature all the grape's flavor and sparkle, yet none of the alcohol.

BEEF KABOBS — Choice pieces of hearty beef are charbroiled to perfection and served on a skewer. A favourite of noble and peasant alike.



SEVILLE SANDWICH — The Spanish are notoriously hot-blooded, perhaps because of foods such as this. Under its zesty sauce you will discover a majestic blend of beef and cheeses wrapped in a flour tortilla and topped with sour cream.

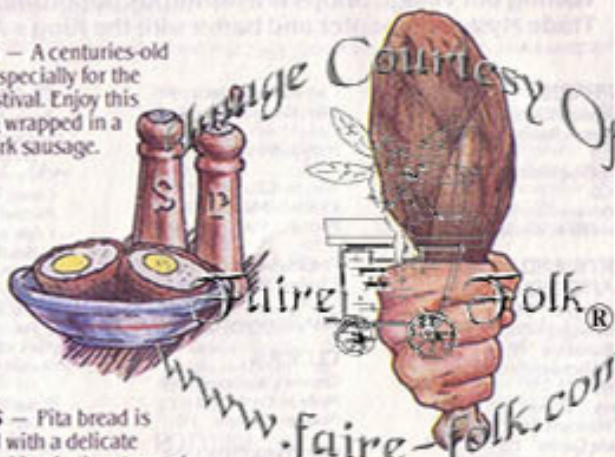
KNAVE SANDWICH — This mainstay of the yeomen features a spicy polish sausage served with sauteed peppers and onions, and crowned with your choice of condiments.

LA CROIX COOLER — The Brewers at the House of Heileman have discovered a fruity alternative to beer or wine. Flavored with strawberries or lemons and limes, this cooler is a perfect thirst quencher.



CORN ON THE COB — Picked from the Royal Gardens, this New World discovery is roasted in its own husk, then dipped in creamery butter. A wholesome addition to your feasting pleasure.

SCOTCH EGGS — A centuries-old recipe revived especially for the Renaissance Festival. Enjoy this hard-boiled egg wrapped in a scrumptious pork sausage.



GREEK GYROS — Pita bread is sliced and filled with a delicate blend of beef and lamb, then topped with garden-fresh tomatoes, lettuce, and onions. A perfect example of Greek civilization for which we are all so grateful.

ICED CREAM SUNDAES — Heaping bowls of frozen creams are topped with the choicest strawberries or the richest chocolates. When you deserve a treat, this concoction is royally recommended.

ICE CREAM COOKIE — Sandwiched betwix two delicious cookies you will find a favourite of Her Majesty: iced cream. A rarity during the Renaissance, yet abundant here in our realm.

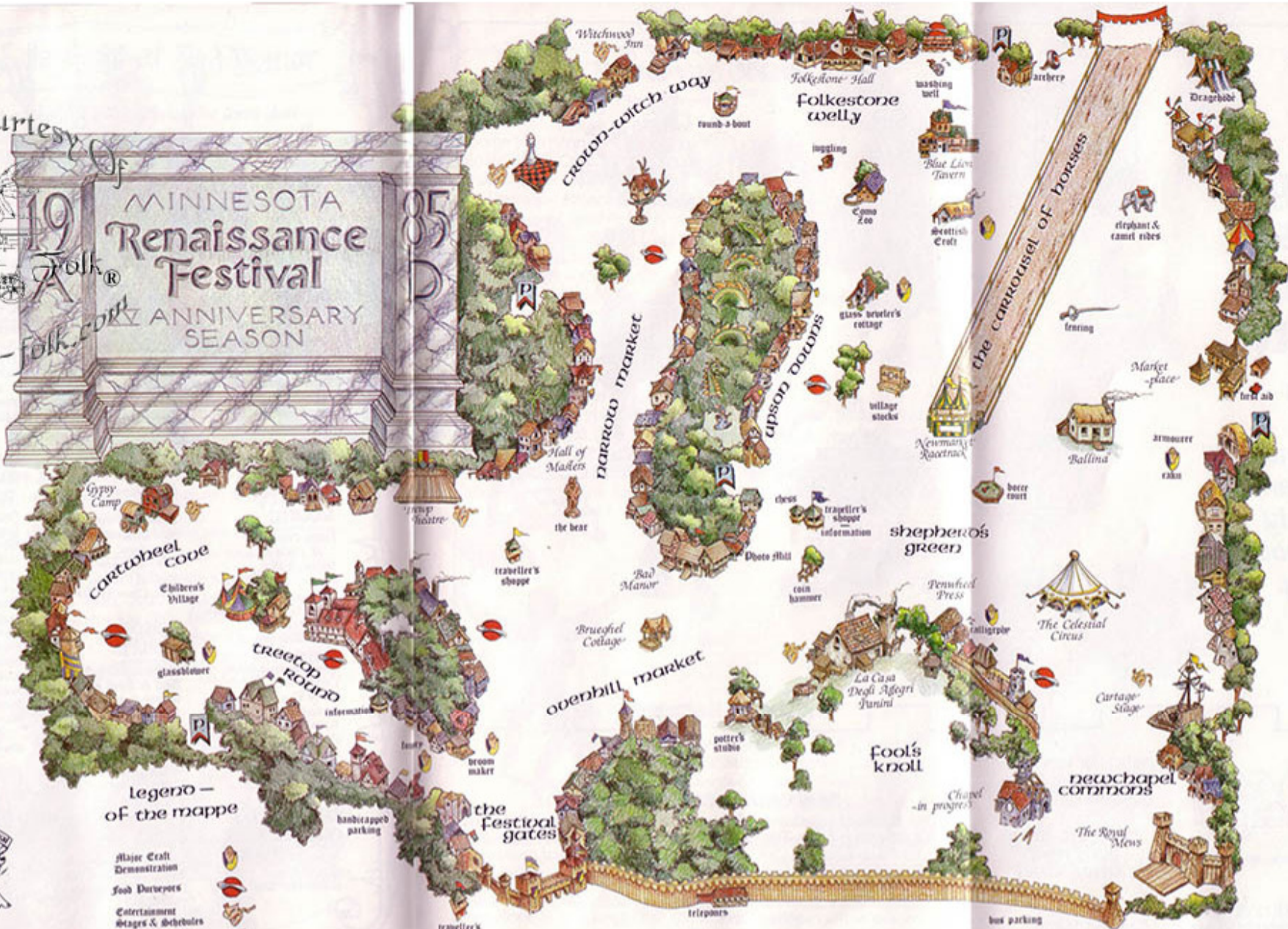

GLASS BEVELING DEMONSTRATION

Artist Jeff Russell daily revives the art of glass beveling at the Glass Cutters Cottage in Upson Downs. The demonstrations feature European techniques that are centuries old.

All the work will be performed by apprentices training under Glass Art Master Russell. Glass will be transformed into works of art through five processes. The Roughing Mill grinds glass into straight-line and outside-curve bevels. The Vertical Lathe creates bevels on inside curves. A Stone Mill smooths the edges made by the first

two processes. The final product is then polished; first by a Cork Wheel, and then a Felt Wheel.

Everyone is invited to attend these demonstrations which will be held at 11:00, 1:00, and 3:00 daily.

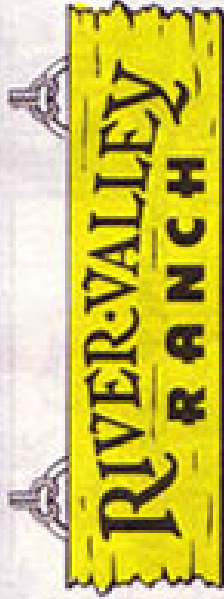
