## SPECIAL EVENTS PAVILLION

Based on the architectural styles of the early French Renaissance, the Special Events Pavillion provides an open-air atmosphere while also providing shelter. Housing a stage on which top-name performers will be featured, the Pavillion has no walls, allowing cooling breezes to blow through and refresh the audience. Should weather turn foul, however, fear not — there is a solid roof for protection, supported by the flying buttresses that distinguish late Medieval/early Renaissance French architecture from its European counterparts.





Taste the nectar of the summer's harvest! Pure, refreshing apple cider, available September 6-28, courtesy of the good people from The Cities 97 FM.






