


Popovers: Whisked from the Queen's kitchen these savory delicacies will nab your nose & tantalize your taste buds! En garde and Bon Appetite!

Shrimp Kabob: Jumbo shrimp and garden fresh vegetables skewered, battered and deep fried to a golden delight.





Pork Steak Sandwich: a tender, succulent pork steak lightly seasoned, grilled and served on a hard roll.



Queen's Caramelized Apples: Fresh apples meticulously sliced and topped with warm, sweet creamed caramel. Served in a dish.



Royale Sweet: Hand-crafted hard candy lollipops in rich fruit flavours depicting Renaissance characters and animals. A fyne treat or remembrance for those at home.

Seafood Pockets: Dive into the refreshing seafood salad and pirate the crisp green waves of lettuce stuffing a tasty pita bread to the gills.



Dessert Pies: Golden pastry crust filled with rich creams or sweet fruits.



Fyne Crafts

Che craft Guildhalls in the Renaissance were as powerful as the courts of the monarchs. Entrance into a trade by way of apprenticeship, complete control of training, a monopoly in the market, and the setting of quality standards for goods were all under the sole supervision of the Guildhall.

The mysteries of a craft were learned during apprenticeship, a period of up to twelve years, during which the apprentice never received pay and sometimes was required to pay a premium. The master took the apprentice into his household, kept him provided with necessities, and chastised him when required to ensure proper training and high quality work.

At the end of the apprentice's term, he became a journeyman, free to work for hire within the craft. Employment was to be found at a particular time each day in a public place - under the sharp eyes of the other crafters, ensuring that no journeyman accepted wages below the minimum and resulting in competitive costs for goods.

The working day was from 5 am, until 8 pm, or from dawn until dusk in winter. A half hour was allowed for breakfast at about 9 am, and an hour and a half for dinner in the afternoon.

Many journeymen remained day laborers for the rest of their lives. Some achieved the rank of artisan by means of examinations. A few were able to satisfy the rigorous requirements of examination and the presentation of a 'masterpiece' to achieve the rank of master.

Having reached a high level of expertise, a master was allowed to set up shop and employ apprentices and journeymen. Through this system the Guildhall exerted a degree of control over its members 'known' by no single constitution today. From this position of power they encouraged a social cohesion that brought together the employer and the employed, meeting the needs of each and ensuring first class goods.

The Hall of Masters

A new display of the finest work of the Festival crafters is developed and installed in the Hall of Masters each week. The Master of the Hall, Lord Eric, is very proud of his exhibits and invites you to come feast your eyes on the wondrous works entrusted to his care by the fine crafters. Folkestone Hall Museum

The good King Henry and his Queen select a few prize pieces each year to purchase from the Festival crafters. Over time, the collection has grown to be the King's finest treasure, representing the artistry and high quality of the Festival crafts.

The entire permanent collection is on display at Folkestone Hall. Come feast your eyes on this magnificent display and see what the Good King Henry considers to be the jewel in his crown.

Craft Demonstrations

The Festival crafters are some of the finest to be found in any kingdom! Many of them offer demonstrations of their craft and will make wondrous creations while you watch! Talk to the crafters and learn the secrets each one has to tell you.

Armour Making

Hourly demonstrations in the ancient craft of armour making using authentic techniques. Watch the forging of weapons and the construction of armour shields and helmets. Learn how to put on a suit of armour, how it is worn, and how to move around in it. Come for a brief demonstration of combat at 5:00 pm.

Bronze Casting

Lost Wax Bronze Casting, used by Renaissance Italian sculptors, features pouring bronze at over 2,000° Fahrenheit. Smoke, flames, and searing heat are present as the molten metal flows into the heated ceramic mold. Methods of clean up are shown upon cooling of the sculpture. Come watch the pourings!





