

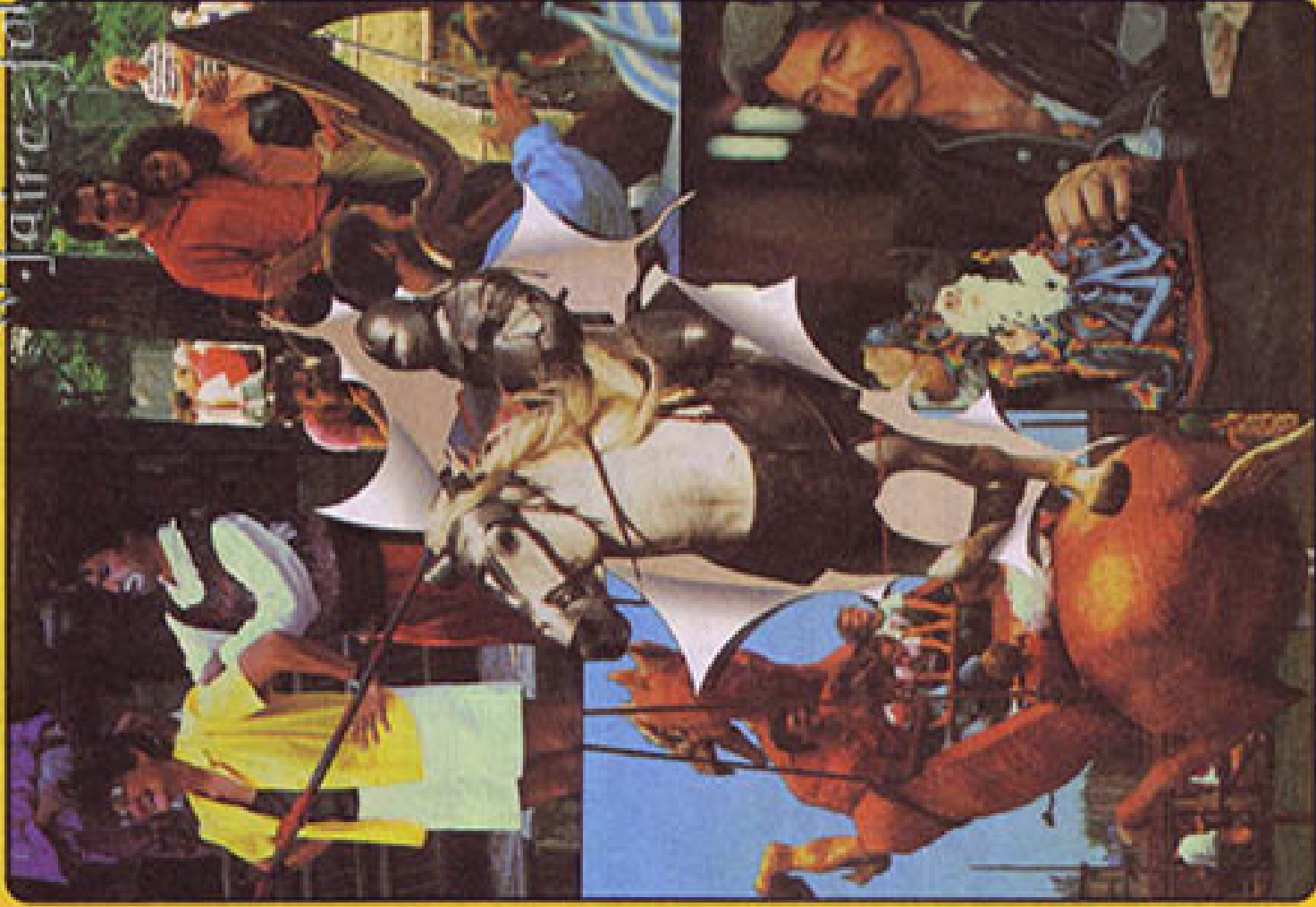

New Treats & Olde Favorites

Chicken Fajitas: One of the treasures brought back by Christopher Columbus. From across the brine comes the taste of richly seasoned chicken strips sauteed with peppers and onions, topped with tomato and salsa, all piled onto a flour tortilla.

Banana Candy: Fresh banana covered half in Belgium White Chocolate, half in Dark Semi-sweet French Chocolate and hand decorated.

Grilled Motzarella: Chunks of fresh motzarella delicately breaded and grilled to a golden brown - served with a light zesty red sauce.

Fresh Fruit Granitas: A gift from the Italians. Fresh fruits are blended with juices and ice to make a frothy, cool, summer drink.

Seville Sandwich: The Spanish are notoriously hot-blooded, perhaps because of foods such as this. Under its zesty sauce you will discover a majestic blend of beef and cheeses wrapped in a flour tortilla and topped with sour cream.

Churros: A delicious stick of Spanish Pastry, sweetend with cinnamon sugar. Order it with a small portion of chocolate for dipping.



Beef Shish Kabob: Choice pieces of hearty beef are charbroiled to perfection and served on a skewer. Long a favourite of noble and peasant alike.

Shrimp Scampi: A seafood delight that makes the mouth water. Large shrimp are sauteed in seasoned garlic butter, and served on a bed of rice.



Woodpecker Hard Apple Cider: This is a wonderful authentic English hard cider brewed from a variety of apples. This alcoholic drink has been the favorite of peasants for years.

Sausage on a Stick: A giant spiced sausage is skewered, grilled, and presented for your palate. A new experience from the Kingdoms of Germany.

Scotch Eggs: A centuries-old recipe revived especially for the Renaissance Festival. Enjoy this hard-boiled egg wrapped in a scrumptious pork sausage.

Strawberry Shortcake: A true shortcake, a button biscuit topped with ice cream and fresh strawberries. A treat brought to us by the Queen's hand maiden.

Scones: Have Tea and Scones with the Queen. Flaky, fragrant, freshly-baked scones with delicious just-brewed hot tea... a delectable treat for breakfast or an afternoon break.

Spicy Cheese Spuds: Arriba! Tantalize your taste buds with these spicy spuds. Delightfully seasoned potato sticks topped with a jalapeno cheese sauce. Ole!

Fyne Crafts

The craft Guildhalls in the Renaissance were as powerful as the courts of the monarchs. Entrance into a trade by way of apprenticeship, complete control of training, a monopoly in the market, and the setting of quality standards for goods were all under the sole supervision of the Guildhall.

The mysteries of a craft were learned during apprenticeship, a period of up to twelve years, during which the apprentice never received pay and sometimes was required to pay a premium. The master took the apprentice into his household, kept him provided with necessities, and chastised him when required to ensure proper training and high quality work.

At the end of the apprentice's term, he became a journeyman, free to work for hire within the craft. Employment was to be found at a particular time each day in a public place - under the sharp eyes of the other crafters, ensuring that no journeyman accepted wages below the minimum and resulting in competitive costs for goods.

The working day was from 5 am. until 8 pm. or from dawn until dusk in winter. A half hour was allowed for breakfast at about 9 am. and an hour and a half for dinner.

Many journeymen remained day laborers for the rest of their lives. Some achieved the rank of artisan by means of examinations. A few were able to satisfy the rigorous requirements of examination and the presentation of a 'masterpiece' to achieve the rank of master.

Having reached a high level of expertise, a master was allowed to set up shop and employ apprentices and journeymen. Through this system the Guildhall exerted a degree of control over its members 'known' by no single constitution today. From this position of power they encouraged a social cohesion that brought together the employer and the employed, meeting the needs of each and ensuring first class goods.

Masters of the Realm

Masters demonstrate a complete understanding of and proficiency in the skills and techniques of a chosen media. Original work exhibiting a thorough knowledge of design, composition and materials can be found in the shops of the Masters of the Realm. The Artisans Market listing shows the Masters in bold-face. A visit to their shops will please and satisfy your artistic sensibilities.

Craft Demonstrations

The Festival crafters are some of the finest to be found in any kingdom! Many of them offer demonstrations of their craft and will make wondrous creations while you watch! Talk to the crafters and learn the secrets each one has to tell you.

Paper Making & Printing

The tools, traditions, and techniques of western papermaking are demonstrated here as crafters take you from rags to paper, touching on some unexpected results of the plague along the way! Immediately following, it's off to a wooden lever press with fresh sheets of paper, as the power and the fear caused by the printed word are examined as well as some insights about playing cards and their influence on the birth of printing.

Glassblowing

The glassblowers of the realm await your arrival. Watch them create wonders from molten glass right before your eyes!

Coin Making

Coin making is an art form which provided the basis for an entire economic system. At the Royal Mint, watch a demonstration of the lost art and technology of the early coin-makers. Using an Italian style screw press and a forge, see an original coin emerge from raw plate brass.

Bronze Casting

Lost Wax Bronze Casting, used by Renaissance Italian sculptors, features pouring bronze at over 2,000° F. Smoke, flames, and searing heat are present as the molten metal flows into the heated ceramic mold. Methods of clean up are shown upon cooling of the sculpture. Come watch the pourings!

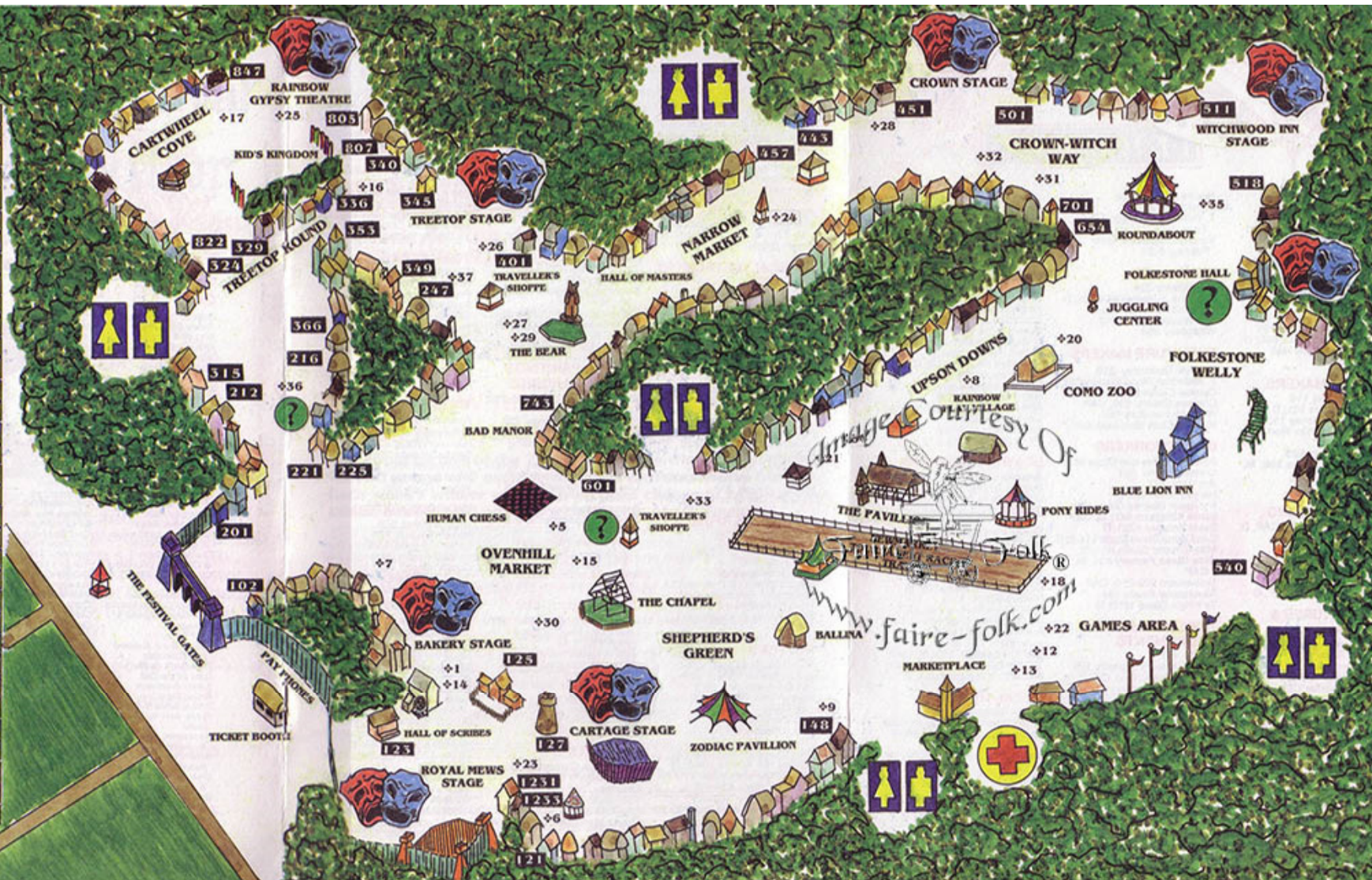

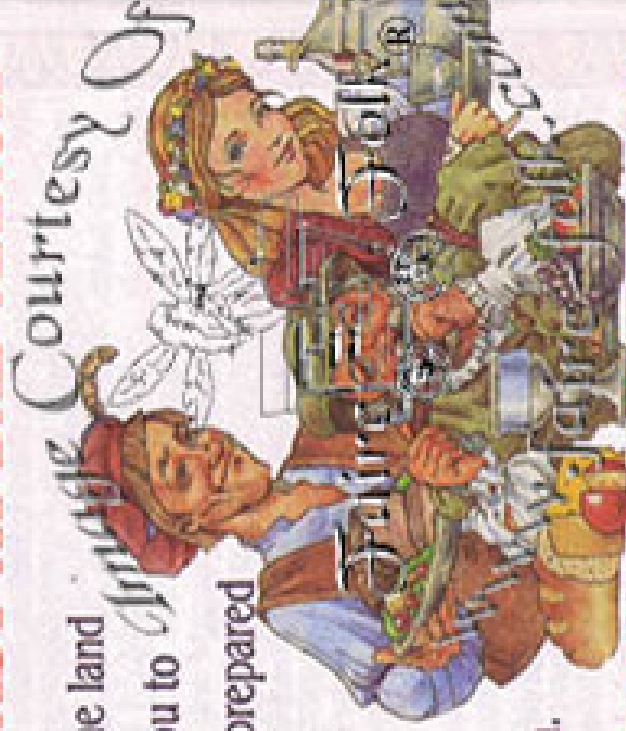
