A ROYAL EXPERIENCE/ENGLISH FOOD FESTIVAL AUGUST 17 - 18

The 21st Anniversary of the Minnesota Renaissance Festival commences with the grandeur only Royalty can bestow. Behold the Mid-West premiere of the British Crown Jewels in replica and the coronation of a Queen. In honor of the British Crown Jewels, tea bags will be given away at the front gate. View the King and his court celebrating the new harvest season with a King's Banquet at Crown Stage. Masque Youth Theatre will enthrall children with their marionette show performed by their Puppet Troupe.

GALLO WINE CARNIVAL/WINE FESTIVAL AUGUST 24 - 25

Come to the Pavillion to savor the popular Gallo Wine presentation of the finer points of varietal wine tasting. See the unique bread sculpture display or sample cheese and wine available throughout the realm. Amateur wine makers are eligible to enter the contest sponsored by Gallo Wines. Adults can jump into the fun at the Grape Stomping Competition and all ages will enjoy the cork popping contest! Masque Youth Theatre mimes present four Commedia style Grimm Brother Tales for children. MIDEAST MIRAGE/ORIENTAL FOOD FESTIVAL SEPTEMBER 14 - 15

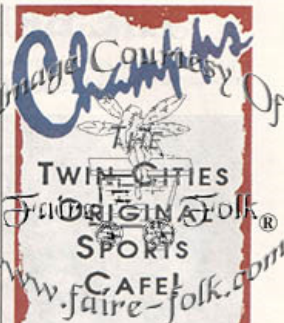

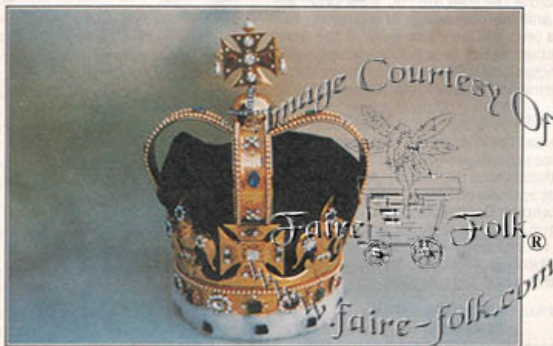

THE BRITISH CROWN JEWELS

in Replica

Every year more than one million people from around the world travel to London, England, to behold the awe inspiring beauty of the British Crown Jewels at the Tower of London. They are without a doubt the most spectacular collection of jewels ever on display anywhere in the world. They are cherished for their historic and religious significance. Their intrinsic value, although incalculable, is relatively unimportant. To the British nation the Crown Jewels are priceless. So valuable and history laden are these jewels, the Queen herself is not permitted to take them out of the country.

The 1991 Minnesota Renaissance Festival is very proud host to the most faithful replicas of the British Crown Jewels ever produced. This 40 piece replica set took a team of jewelers over two years to complete. Each piece of the collection is shown in full size and is blueprinted to the exact specifications of the original.

These jewels so closely resemble the originals that in August of 1987, a British couple were held for twelve hours at the German-Belgian border on suspicion of stealing the 'real' British Crown Jewels. Despite their protest, they were unable to convince customs officials that their entire collection

was replicas. The replica collection was headed for an exhibition in Bonn, Germany to celebrate its forty years as a twin city with Oxford.

The British Crown Jewel exhibit contains some of the most celebrated artifacts in the world including The Imperial State Crown which the Monarch wears after Coronation and again at the Opening of Parliament each year. The Imperial State Crown is the world's most priceless item of jewelry. It is the resting place of the famous 'Black Prince's Ruby' and the 'Second Star of Africa Diamond' (317 carats) cut from the 'Cullinan Diamond' which is the largest diamond ever mined. The remainder of this spectacular crown is glorified with 2,800 diamonds, sapphires, rubies, and pearls.

The exhibit also contains 'The Sceptre With The Cross' which is held in the right hand of the Sovereign during the crowning. The Sceptre contains the world's largest cut diamond, 'The First Star of Africa' which weighs a full 530 carats. This stunning pear shaped jewel was also cut from the 'Cullinan Diamond' which was found in South Africa in 1905 and weighed 3,106 carats.

Observe the ceremonial changing of the guards, who will be stationed to protect the majestic jewels. The entire 40 piece exhibit was made possible by the Minnesota State Lottery, proceeds of which benefit Minnesota's natural and economic environment. They can be seen in Folkestone Hall which is located in Folkestone Welly, just beyond the Newmarket Tournament Racetrack; home to the Jousting Knights.

Helping Minnesota Enjoy The Good Life



The Lottery Contributes More Than Entertainment to Minnesota.

Each time you play the Lottery a portion of your dollar benefits all Minnesotans through the Environment and Natural Resources Fund. The Trust Fund finances projects intended to preserve, restore and enhance our state's natural resources. The General Fund finances programs and services that include education, public safety and environmental protection. For Fiscal 1991, ending June 30, 1991, the Lottery generated approximately \$86 million for these programs, helping support the good life in Minnesota.

Introducing The King's Lot

The practice of drawing lots dates back to ancient times. In fact, the first lottery with cash prizes dates back to 1490, two years before Columbus discovered America. Lotteries then spread across land and time helping to raise money to finance projects from road construction to support of tradition rich institutes such as Harvard, Yale, and Princeton.

The Minnesota State Lottery introduced their first game of chance in April, 1990. A variety of Lottery games are now available in Minnesota. State Lottery proceeds benefit Minnesota's natural and economic environment.

'King's Lot' tickets, depicting such Renaissance characters as Kings, Queens, Jacks and Jokers, are available for purchase by those citizens of the Realm that are 18 years of age and older. 'King's Lot' tickets can be purchased at participating Minnesota Renaissance Festival wine booths. Should you strike a lucky ticket, stand up and shout, 'Huzzah! good fortune commeth my way!!!'

Craft Demonstrations

The Minnesota Renaissance Festival craftspeople are the finest to be found in any kingdom. They are eager to share their knowledge and entertain by demonstrating their skills, many actively involve those who gather 'round. Watch, listen, and question - discover the age-old secrets of their crafts.



Papermaking and Printing

The impact of the printed word was important in Renaissance life. The art of western papermaking provides a fascinating and enjoyable learning experience. Through a process employing traditional tools and techniques, rags emerge as paper before your eyes. An authentic Gutenberg-style press is used to demonstrate the art of hand-printing. Ink placed on a leather ball is transferred to hand-set type. The press is then used to make an imprint of the type on paper.

Calligraphy

Free half-hour calligraphy classes are offered at the Hall of Scribes four times daily. Learn the Gothic alphabet and try your hand at Renaissance doodling. Classes are limited to 16 students. In addition to the classes, calligraphy demonstrations are ongoing throughout the day. Whether you watch or become a student, you'll enjoy your visit with the Scribes.

Bronze Casting

Lost Wax Bronze Casting, used by Renaissance Italian sculptors, features pouring bronze at over 2,000 degrees F. Behold the smoke, flames, and searing heat as the molten metal flows into the heated ceramic mold. Methods of clean-up are shown when the sculpture cools. Come, watch the pourings!

Glassblowing

The glassblowers of the Realm await your arrival with bated breath, eager to create wonders from molten glass for your amazement and surprise. Follow the process from the first red-hot blob until the 'objet d'art' emerges from the annealing oven.

Armor Making

Witness demonstrations of the ancient craft of armor-making, using authentic techniques. Observe the forging of weapons and the construction of armor shields and helmets. Discover the secrets of donning armor, how to wear it, and how to move around in it.

Pewter-Casting Workshop

A discussion of basic sculpture techniques, wax designing and mold-making is followed by the actual creation of an open-face sand-cast design. The final step of the demonstration is the joining of the goblet to the stem.

For a small fee, patrons can create a Festival medallion. To do so, the patron presses a master form into casting sand to produce an impression. Attendants then pour molten metal into this 'mold.' Once the medallion cools, the patron scrubs, buffs and antiques it. A very personal souvenir!

Clay Studio and Kiln

A potter's kick wheel and a wood-fired kiln are focal points of this newly completed working potters studio. Watch the transition from a lump of clay to an artistic pottery shape under the skilled hands of the wheel operator. Sniff the aroma of wood smoke as the greenware is slipped into the kiln for firing.

Masters of the Realm

The Masters Program at the Minnesota Renaissance Festival is unique. Established in 1982 and inspired by Craft Guildhalls of the Renaissance, it creates an artistically challenging environment where craftspeople can learn from one another and grow creatively. It provides both a forum for the exchange of ideas and a reward for excellence.

As a first step to being named Master, a craftsperson must be nominated by current Festival Masters, with the nominee's work being exhibited in the Hall of Masters for review. Every aspect of the prospective Master's participation is evaluated, from quality of work to methods of production - from display design to costumes.

A stepping-stone for many who ultimately attain Master status is the designation of Artisan. 'Master' is truly a royal honor, with new craft Masters being knighted by the King. You will find the names of Masters highlighted in the Artisan's Market listing.

Dame Pamela's first year of participation was in 1978 and she was named 'Master' in 1982. From early beginnings in beadwork through courses in Art Metal at the University of Wisconsin and a continual process of self-education, Dame Pamela has emerged as a Master Jeweler of our Realm. After spending time at the Anderson Ranch Art Center in Aspen, CO, she and her husband/partner Dan Rist settled in Telluride, CO. They participate in over 20 major art shows nationwide each year.

Named Master in 1982, Sir Neal is now in his 21st year of Festival participation. As a child in Arizona and as an Art History major at the University of Arizona, Sir Neal was influenced by Native American and Southwest jewelry. After studying in Germany on a Fulbright Scholarship, he spent two years with the Peace Corps in Brazil, which is known for its gemstones. With his interest in jewelry rekindled, Sir Neal became a full-time jeweler soon after his return. He now concentrates on custom work from his studio in St. Louis Park, MN, doing only a few local shows each year.

Named Masters in 1982, their first year of participation was in 1980. Former high school art teachers, the Robertsons have worked together as full-time potters since 1978. Sir Richard served as executive director of the Dubuque Museum of Art from 1988-1990 and helped establish the first capitol campaign to rehabilitate a National Landmark 'County Jail' into an Art Museum. Dame Elizabeth guided the production and marketing of 'Bubble Wands', invented for sale at the Minnesota Renaissance Festival in 1984. The Minnesota Renaissance Festival provides a rare opportunity to meet the Robertsons away from their studio in Dubuque, IA.

Roasted Nuts: Freshly roasted and lightly salted, they are the perfect nibbler to satisfy the wandering shopper.

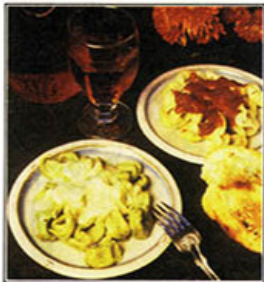


Cinnamon Twist: A sweet medley of cinnamon and sugar weaved into a twisted roll. ▲

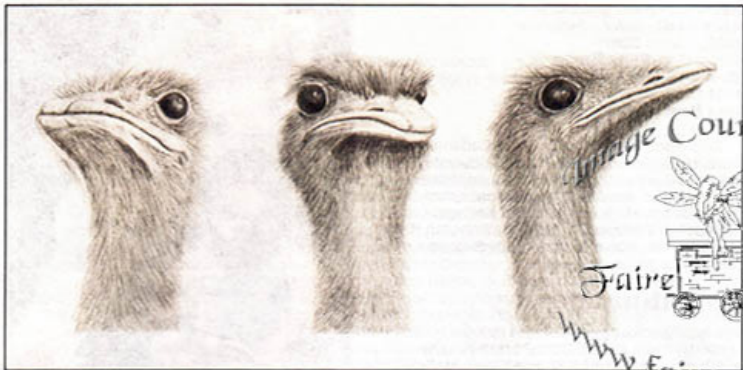

Lou has enjoyed 16 years of extraordinary development at the festival, showing drawings and prints at Shop #431. This year he is presenting a remarkable collection of limited edition prints from 50 new drawings which include elephants, frogs, flamingos, croc-

odiles, cats, and more. The portrait-like images in this collection may make you laugh, or the finely rendered, peculiar looking creatures may simply make you smile. All are sure to amaze you.

A decade ago he traveled to small towns around Minnesota conducting "color concerts": symphonies of color played by townspeople painting murals on bandshells, town halls, and other public

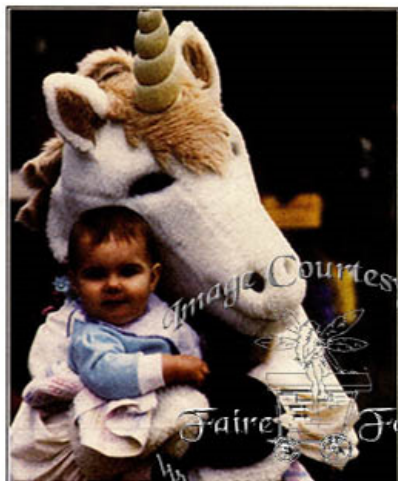
