Thus with anticipation, we bid you welcome, and urge you to remember King Henry's royal decree: "The Adventure Is Yours!"

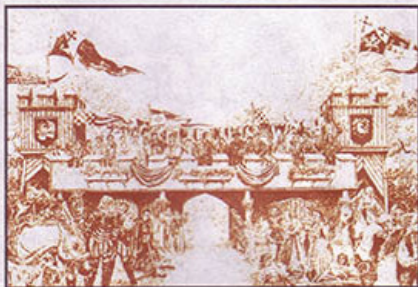

# What Was The Renaissance?



he intellectual, cultural, and artistic movement known as the "Renaissance" began in Florence, Italy during the 14th Century, and had encompassed the entirety of Europe by the beginning of the 17th Century. The Renaissance was an age of enlightenment, but more over it was an age of education, exploration, discovery, and adventure!

The Renaissance movement was inspired by a secular spirit - less religious than that of the dark ages. People developed a renewed interest in classical civilization. Laymen and princes encouraged and expected people to learn poetry, art, literature, and practice in the ways of chivalry. As these neoteric ideas spread throughout Europe, there was a separation from Medieval thinking and a rebirth of creative thought, a renewal of classical art, and a revival of classical literature and architecture.

The spirit of optimism that this historic movement represents is preserved here at the Minnesota Renaissance Festival. And visitors, one and all, are invited to share in the gallantry, beauty, romance, and adventure that is the Renaissance!

# Craft Demonstrations



*The Minnesota Renaissance Festival artisans are the finest to be found in any kingdom. They are eager to share their knowledge and entertain you by demonstrating their skills and actively involving all who gather 'round. Watch, listen, question and discover some age-old secrets of their crafts.*

**Metal-Casting Workshop** - A discussion of basic sculpture, wax designing and mold making is followed by the actual creation of an open-face sand-cast design. The next steps are clean-up and torch work, antiquing and buffing. The final step of the demonstration is the joining of the goblet to the stem. For a small fee, you can create a Festival medallion. To do so, you press a "master" form into casting sand to produce an impression. Then, pour molten metal into this "mold." Once the medallion cools you can buff and antique your medallion to complete your very own Festival treasure. Workshops are held throughout the day beginning at 11:00 am.

K Dopita Studio (Shop #152-153)

**Papermaking, Printing and Bookbinding** - The impact of the printed word caused many changes in Renaissance life. Witness rags emerge as paper through a process employing traditional tools and techniques. A wooden lever Gutenberg-style press is used to demonstrate the art of hand printing. Using an inked leather ball and handset type, an imprint is made on the paper. Skilled hands sew the pages together to form a completed book. Windrose Mill (Shop #120 - at the Water Wheel)



**Brass Rubbing** - A unique opportunity to create your very own historical keepsake. Replicas of monumental brasses are used, all of which are persons and places existing from Medieval and Renaissance periods in England. Rubbings are made by placing white rice paper and heavy black or gold paper over the brass. Heel balls rubbed over the paper make the impression. Techniques of rubbing are explained and demonstrated.

## **Musical Instrument Making**

Visit an authentic luthier's workshop to see how harps, lutes, other stringed instruments and drums are made. Watch as intricate knotwork patterns are carefully cut into the soundboard to create the beautiful carved rose or soundhole on the front of each lute. In keeping with authentic renaissance tradition, a drum will be finished before your eyes by fitting the head to the drum body.

**Calligraphy** - Free half-hour classes are offered at the Hall of Scribes four times daily. Learn the Gothic alphabet and try your hand at Renaissance doodling. Classes are limited to 15 students. In addition to the classes, calligraphy demonstrations are ongoing throughout the day. Free classes will be taught by His Majesty's scribes at 11:15 am, Noon, 2:15 and 3:00 pm. Hall of Scribes (Shop #7205 - at the Water Wheel)



**Glassblowing** - The glassblowers of the Realm await your arrival with bated breath, eager to create wonders from molten glass for your amazement and surprise. Follow the process from the first red-hot blob until the "objet d'art" emerges from the annealing oven.

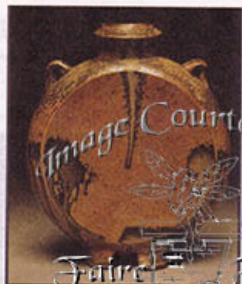
## **Beekeeping and Water Sculpting**

See a working beehive and have an expert explain the life cycle of bees. Try your hand at making a creative water sculpture of beeswax. Special talent is not required and it's fun for all ages. Honey Candles (Shop #215-216)

**Armor Making** - Witness demonstrations of the ancient craft of armor making, using authentic techniques. Observe the forging of weapons and the construction of armor, shields and helmets. Discover the secrets of donning armor, how to wear it, and how to move around in it.

# 3 Renaissance Masters:



**Sir Craig Edwards**  
Banner Oak Pottery  
(Shops #1111P)

Master Edwards is a true Renaissance potter. He has experimented with many different methods of creating pottery, but has found his true calling in wood-fired, salt glazed pottery.

Stoking his authentic, wood-burning kiln to a temperature of 2400 degrees, Master Edwards is able to create his attractive pottery. Once Edwards gets his kiln to the desired temperature, he throws in salt. The sodium in the salt melts and combines with melted ash from the kiln itself. The result is a glaze on the pottery that cannot be duplicated by any other firing process.

Salt glazed pottery was originally developed by potters in West Germany, and it was in Germany that Edwards was first exposed to this unique art. Edwards went to high school in Rusesheim, West Germany, before making his home in the United States.

In 1967-68, Edwards attended the South Dakota School of Mines and Technology where he studied Geology. Next, Edwards furthered his education in pottery at the American River College in Fair Oaks, California.

Pottery is a full-time occupation for Edwards. He lives with his wife, Lynn, and two sons, Nick and Dan, on a farm in west central Minnesota.



**Sir Dan Hirssig**  
Wizard Wax Works  
(Shop #206)

Charming, attractive, lifelike, and lovable are Dan Hirssig's wax creations at Wizard Wax Works. From animals to complicated caricatures of wizards and dragons, Hirssig's work has fascinated people for years.

Hirssig's complicated process starts out by dipping a layered piece of colored wax, and then keeping the wax at 120 degrees so that it remains soft and pliable while the sculpture is being shaped. The piece is then cooled slowly so it maintains its shape.

Hirssig began participation in the Minnesota Renaissance Festival in 1975 as a member of a consortium of crafters. It was in that year that he met his wife, Sondra. They have two daughters, Alicia and Amber, both of whom have attended the Festival each year of their lives. In 1978, Hirssig left the consortium to open his own shop.

Wax Works and the creation of his special "creatures" is a full-time occupation for Hirssig. He has a bachelor of Science degree from the University of Wisconsin at Madison, and is currently enrolled in Chiropractic school at The Life College located just outside of Atlanta, Georgia.



**Dame Christina Ouma**  
Artemis Leather  
(Shop #612)

Specializing in one-of-a-kind "Artwear" leather, Christina Ouma has helped people express their personalities. Ouma says that she enjoys the challenge of matching her hand-crafted work with a person's personality, and that she feels lucky to have been successful in doing so. It is this challenge that keeps Ouma's artistic inspiration alive! Ouma believes that each piece she hand creates expresses something about an individual's nature. Ouma creates most of her work from subtle deerskin using no patterns, just measurements from the individual she is creating it for; all of her clothing is hand washable.

Ouma's work can also be found at both the Colorado and Texas Renaissance Festivals. Ouma also participates in two fashion shows, one in Santa Fe, New Mexico - where her work is displayed in an art gallery - and another in Dallas, Texas, where she displayed over 80 pieces at the last show.

Ouma hails from Minneapolis. She has been happily married for ten years to Aboge, and has two children, daughter Ahsa Ouma and son Mark Hansen. When she is not creating Artwear Leather, she performs and teaches oriental dance at the Pillsbury House in South Minneapolis.



# Brilliant Reflections

## Sir Ken Patzoldt and Dame Manbeck Stained Glass Windows and Sculptures Timberwind (Shop #209-210)



Stained glass and stained glass windows have been admired since long before the Renaissance. Most people associate the art of stained glass windows with churches, but Sir Ken and Dame Jo, of Timberwind (Shop #209-210), have freed themselves from this conventional application to explore new realms of expression. "Rather than serving a specific function, glass is now recognized as an artistic media in itself, being utilized in cabinetry, as architectural sculpture, and to accent decor," says Sir Ken.

Unlike traditional church window construction, Dame Jo and Sir Ken use a technique called "copper-foil construction." This technique, made famous in the 19th century by Louis C. Tiffany, and his famed "Tiffany lamps," enables the artists to create exciting forms in three dimensions. Each of unique glass sculpture is custom designed. Before hand, a template is made and the finest of custom hand-blown and antique glass is individually hand-cut and wrapped in copper foil, providing a metal surface for the molten lead and solder to adhere to. Each piece is then fused into place with the utmost of care.

Sir Ken and Dame Jo have participated in the Minnesota Renaissance Festival since 1980. Located near the village stocks, their unique shop, with its courtyard, vine covered natural canopy, and wishing well, has become a favorite among Festival visitors. Sir Ken and Dame Jo were named Masters at the Minnesota Renaissance Festival, in 1990. In 1991, the couple was inducted into knighthood by His Majesty King Henry. Their work is dis-



played as part of the Renaissance Collection at Folkstone Hall.

As residents of northern Minnesota, Sir Ken and Dame Jo are intensely involved in their community. They have built a self-sufficient 40 acre homestead where they gather their own food, and live off of the land. Their commitment to the environment is exemplary, they strive to set an example that may result in global awareness, a concern for nature, and an appreciation of the importance of beauty and balance in our surroundings that will result in the making of a better future all.

## The Renaissance Collection



In 1980, in recognition of the Minnesota Renaissance Festival's 10th Anniversary year, the **Craft Acquisition Program (or CAP)** was started. CAP's goal is to purchase exceptional craft work by Festival craftspeople. CAP forms the core of what is now known as **THE RENAISSANCE COLLECTION**.

In the early years, pieces to be purchased were determined by recommendations from craftspeople and final balloting by the Festival staff. In the mid-1980's CAP traveled to different galleries, malls, businesses and promotions, and served as a sort of ambassador visually showing the artistry and beauty of quality handcrafted work and giving people a small taste of the crafts they might find when they visit the Festival.

As the **Masters Program** became more established, it became a goal of CAP to include a piece representative of every craftsman who has attained the status of Master. Pieces continue to be purchased each year, and the Collection has grown to be one of the best of its kind.

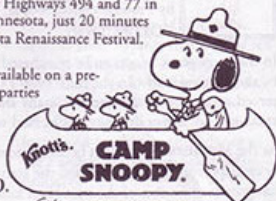

# Festival Craft Exhibits

## Hall of Masters

All Festival craftspeople are invited to exhibit in the **Hall of Masters** at least twice during the Festival season. A new exhibit is mounted each Saturday morning and removed at the end of the weekend. The Festival's "News of the Realm" announces the featured categories each weekend.

No sales occur at the Hall. The exhibit provides a showcase for the crafts present at the Festival and an excellent opportunity to see many craftspeople's work at one time. The **Hall of Masters** is conveniently located near the "Big Bear." It is staffed by helpful, knowledgeable keepers who will be happy to answer your questions and direct you to the shop of the maker of any work which piques your interest.

Craft galleries are becoming more numerous with the resurgence in the popularity of crafts, but the exhibits at the **Hall of Masters** offer an option no other commercial or educational gallery does: after comparing the works of different craftspeople, the viewer can easily go to the shop of the maker of any particular piece, meet the maker, and see many more pieces of their work.

## Folkstone Hall

**Folkstone Hall** has become known as **THE RENAISSANCE MUSEUM** for good reason. Permanent craft collections are owned by only a few Museums in the United States, and even fewer display their craft collections in permanent exhibits. The American Craft Council exhibits their craft collection in New York City, the Smithsonian in Washington DC, and in celebration of 1993 The Year of American Craft, a new craft museum is opening in Los Angeles. The Minnesota Museum located in St Paul also owns a craft collection and has plans to exhibit it. Some Museums also rent traveling craft collections for limited-time exhibitions.

The Festival is especially proud of our contribution to preserving craft works for future generations in the building of the **Renaissance Collection** and in our consistency in exhibiting the **Collection** each year during the Festival in Folkstone Hall.

## Grilled Pork Chop:

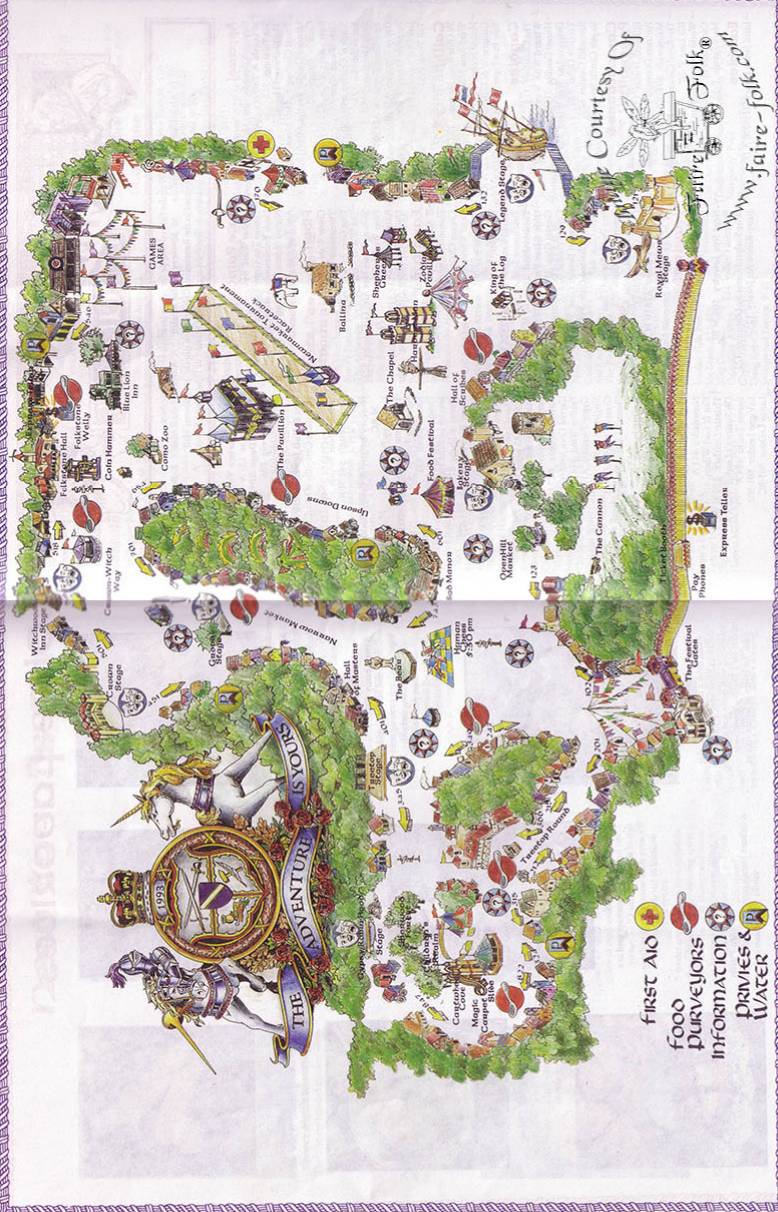
A plump pork chop grilled on a bed of hot coals, seasoned and served on a skewer.

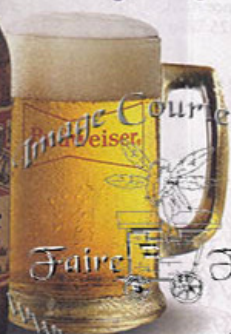
