

ATM/CASH TRANSACTIONS: Express Teller™ cash machines located outside the Main Entrance by the Ticket Booth and on the north end of the Festival grounds in Folkestone Welly.



# What Was The Renaissance?

he intellectual, cultural, and artistic movement known as the "Renaissance" began in Florence, Italy during the 14th Century, and had encompassed the

entirety of Europe by the beginning of the 17th Century. The Renaissance was an age of enlightenment, but moreover it was an age of education, exploration, discovery, and adventure!

The Renaissance movement was inspired by a secular spirit; less religious than that of the dark ages. People developed a renewed interest in classical civilization. Laymen and princes encouraged and expected people to learn poetry, art, literature, and practice in the ways of chivalry. As these neoteric ideas spread throughout Europe, there was a separation from Medieval thinking

and a rebirth of creative thought, a renewal of classical art, and a revival of classical literature and architecture.

The spirit of optimism that this historic movement represents is preserved here at the Minnesota Renaissance Festival. And visitors, one and all, are invited to share in the gallantry, beauty, romance, and adventure that is the Renaissance!







# Craft Demonstrations



the Water Wheel)

he Minnesota Renaissance Festival artisans are the finest to be found in any Kingdom. They are eager to share their knowledge and entertain by demonstrating their skills and actively involving all who gather around. Watch, listen and question some of the ancient secrets of these crafts.

Calligraphy: Four times a day, free classes are offered at the Hall of Scribes. Learn the Gothic alphabet or Renaissance doodling. Limited availability. Hall of Scribes (Shop #1205- at



Perfume Making: Visit the Alchemist and watch perfumes and body care products being hand-made. Visitors are invited to make their own unique scent. The Alchemist (Shop # 333-334)

Glassblowing: Wonders are created from molten glass. Follow the process from the first red-hot mass until the object "d-art" emerges from the annealing oven.



Paper-making, Printing, Bookbinding, Marbling and Etching: A wooden lever Gutenberg-style press is used to turn rags into paper through a process employing traditional tools and techniques and skilled hands sew the pages together to form a book. A demonstration of etching and marbling completes the series of activities in the Mill. Wind Rose Mill (Shop # 120 - at the Water Wheel)



Engraving: A short history lesson of printing, touching on relief prints, intaglio, and engraving. Audience members assist in the authentic process of creating an engraved print. Cock 'n Dragon (Shop #215-216)

Brass Rubbing: Create your own historical keepsake. Replicas of monumental brasses dating from English Medieval and Renaissance periods are used. Techniques of rubbing are explained and I demonstrated.

Wax Figure Sculpting: A formless mass of molten wax turns into a fantasy creation under the skilled hands of a master craftsman. Make a guess as to what the final end product will be! Wax Wizard Works (Shop # 206)



Armor Making: Witness weapons and armor from the past. Discover the secrets of donning armor, how to wear it, and how to move it around. Arms & Armor (Shop # 146-148)

Metal-Casting Workshop: A discussion of basic sculpture, designing, and mold making is followed by the creation of a sand-cast design. Clean-up, antiquing and buffing are also explained. For a small fee, you can create your own Festival Medallion by pressing a "master" form.

### 1996 Renaissance Masters

#### Dame Ruth Ipsan-Brown Sandcasting #104

Dame Ruth Ipsan-Brown began sandcasting while on a picnic at a sandy beach in Iowa. Since that picnic in the 1950's, she has developed her own style and has been selling sandcastings for the past 25 years.

The abstract designs are created through a simple process beginning with the gathering and sculpting of natural sand from lowa, Illinois, New Mexico, Utah, Colorado, Massachusetts and other areas. Hydrocal, a plaster cement, is then poured into the sculpture and a hook is added. Once the hydrocal is set, the sandcasting is removed and excess sand is sprayed off. The piece is now ready to hang on the wall.

Lady Ruth and her husband Cliff reside in lowa and participate in the Minnesota, North Carolina, and Arizona Renaissance Festivals in addition to numerous juried art fairs.



#### Sir Roger McNear North Wind Leather #1232

Sir Roger began his career while working in a leather shop in Mankato and has been creating leather goods for 27 years. Traditional items such as belts and luggage were created in the beginning. Today, he has broadened his work to include contemporary sculpture.



"The way I touch the natural world and attempt to be a part of that world combines with my affinity for Native American culture and the animals that make up our physical and spiritual world, " says McNear. His latest work is illustrative of shamanistic totems and their relationship with the natural world. Achievement and recognition is based on his commitment to provide products that he has truly handmade; therefore, Sir Roger has been a treasured artist of the Minnesota Renaissance Festival for over 10 years.

Presently, Sir Roger owns his own business called North Wind Leather and lives with his wife and 14 year old daughter in east central Minnesota.

#### Dame Marnee Taylor & Sir Paul Taylor Taylor Jewelry #127

Combining their artistic and technical talents, Sir Paul and Dame Marnee Taylor have been creating detailed pieces of jewelry for the past 20 years. Inspiration for the traditional pieces comes primarily from nature. Daughters Heather (12) and Katie (9) assist in the creation of whimsical designs.

Each piece is drawn without the use of stencils, photography or other reproductive methods. It is then crafted in sterling silver and 14k rose, green, and yellow gold. The couple likes to experiment with new techniques and materials; but the majority of their work is created by engraving, riveting, piercing, stone setting, and acid etching. Their creations include necklaces, pendants, earrings, rings, bracelets, brooches, and occasionally items such as letter openers.



Sir Paul and Dame Marnee have received many awards as well as a great amount of recognition. They participate in juried shows throughout Florida, California, Texas, and Arizona.

# Hand-Blown Glass Masters Enjoy Sharing Their Craft With Festival Patrons

#### Sir Jon Bush and Sir David Tate Ye King's Glass #A1810

The ancient and elegant art of hand blown glass is something renowned sculptor Jon Bush thoroughly enjoys. Manipulating molten glass with blowpipes and tools while using a traditional blown glass tech-



nique is his primary mode of working glass.

Currently, Sir Jon makes his own crucibles and formulates

his own glass batches and castables. He also applies his ceramic background to the construction of glass furnaces. His pieces are featured in a number of galleries and giftshops throughout the Southwest. Sir Jon demonstrates his craft for thousands at Renaissance Festivals in Minnesota and Colorado. The open air studios at the fairs are enjoyable and

the sharing of a seldom seen craft is most rewarding," says Bush.

Sir David Tate has been interested in the art of blowing glass for 13 years and has worked with Jon Bush for the past 7 years.



Elegant vases as

well as pitchers with matching tumblers, paperweights, bowls, Christmas ornaments, and hand blown glass fish are available for purchase at the Festival. His most recent accomplishment is the reproduction of turn-of-the- century art glass pieces.

"I like the escape I can achieve by diving into my work and being immersed in it...being intensely focused on pieces I make, makes me forget about everything else I need to do," says Sir. David.

#### HALL OF MASTERS

The Hall of Masters, located in the structure known as Folkstone Hall, features a showcase of the arts and crafts represented at the Festival. A new exhibit representing three to four types of media is constructed each weekend. The Hall is staffed by helpful, knowledgeable attendants who will be happy to answer questions and direct you to the shop of the creator of any piece that catches your eye. The Festival's "News of the Realm" announces the featured categories each weekend.

#### THE GALERIE

The Galerie is the home of three extraordinary artisan exhibits. The King's Armor Collection is a unique display of arms and armor handcrafted by artists throughout the country. The Renaissance of Dolls Collection features a variety of dolls costumed in Renaissance garb and uniquely displayed among their own village cottages. The Renaissance Collection represents exceptional work of Festival artisans in all media. Each year, the Festival purchases pieces to add to the Collection. Early acquisitions were chosen on the basis of recommendations from Festival artisans, with final purchase decisions made by the Festival staff.






