 **ATM/CASH TRANSACTIONS:** Express Teller™ cash machines are located outside the Main Entrance by the Ticket Booth, on the north end of the Festival grounds in Folkestone Welly and near Cartwheel Cove.

The **FEAST OF FANTASY** has become a traditional part of the Renaissance Festival experience for many patrons. Treat yourself like royalty by indulging in a delicious





The couple met in college, at UW-Superior, where they were both studying art. Jim began with ceramics, where he gained an appreciation for the glazes; this intrigued him and led him to glass blowing.

His partner in art, work and life, Sue, has been teaching high school art classes since 1979, where she shares the unique and intricate process of glasswork with the artists of the future.

In 1967, Jim started his own studio, where he built his first furnace. Now, Jim and Sue make a wide range of blown, stained and fused glassware at their Oulu Glass and Gallery in Brule, Wisconsin. Both give demonstrations and create their masterpieces there.

Glass blowing requires patience and attention to detail. During the repetitive blowing and shaping process, Jim and Sue often blow up to 40 individual pieces a day. It is apparent in their work that each creation is handled with the most delicate care and possesses a part of them both.

The couple works as a team to create their unusual and unique pieces. Much of their work is done in a nontraditional manner. Jim often blows glass parts for Sue to merge with stained glass panels hence creating one-of-a-kind treasures. A majority of their work is custom, to fit the needs of their clients; all their designs are original and are drawn from their passion for life and their art.




