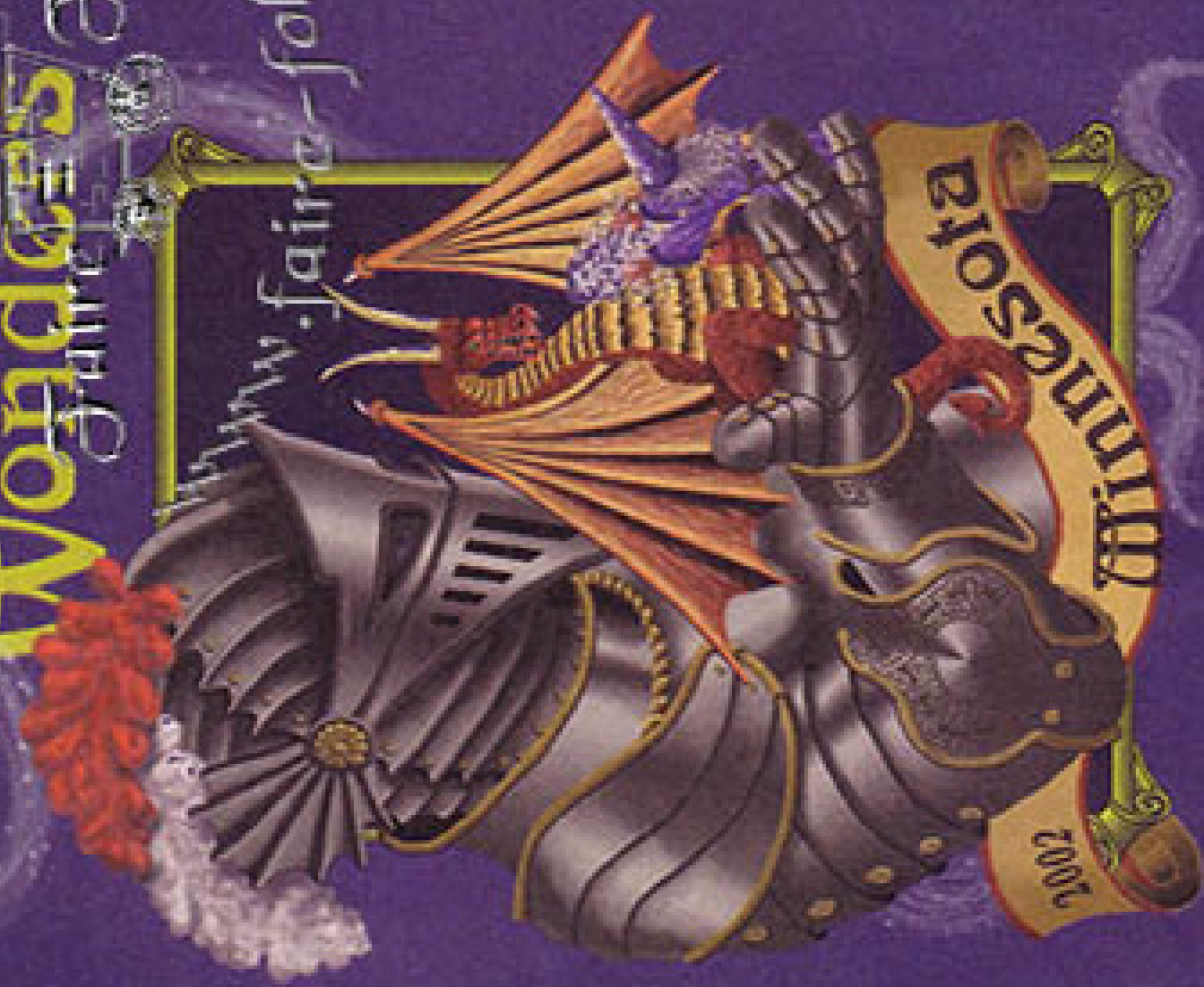



 **ATM/CASH TRANSACTIONS:** Express Teller™ cash machines located outside the Main Entrance by the Ticket Booth, on the north end of the Festival grounds in Folkestone Welly and near Cartwheel Cove.



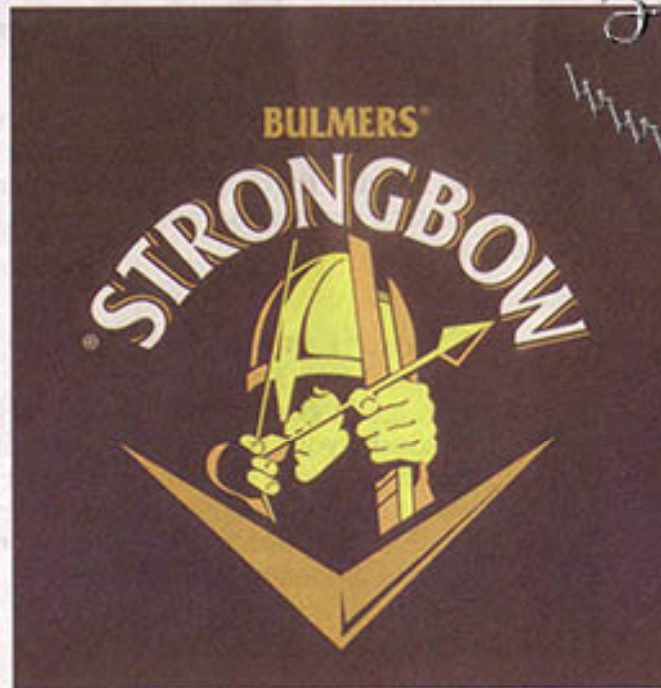

## Artisan Demonstrations

Minnesota Renaissance Festival artisans are the finest to be found in any Kingdom. They educate and entertain by sharing knowledge and demonstrating skills. Watch, listen and ask questions! Listed below are those who are returning to share the lore of their craft. Demonstration times can be found in the Festival Broadsheet or at the Information Booth.

**BLACKSMITHING:** A blacksmithing duo, master and apprentice, demonstrate techniques of metalworking as they would have been performed as early as the 10th Century. No modern tools used here! RAVENSMITHS (P-43)

**BOOTS AND SHOES:** Hand designed and handmade before your eyes. A craft and product that's timeless. BEAVER TRACKS (Shop #444)

**BRASS RUBBING:** Create your own keepsake from the past. Replicas of brasses dating from English Medieval and the Renaissance periods are used. The technique of rubbing is demonstrated and explained. BRASSWOOD (Shop #744)

**FINE ARTS:** Learn the techniques of a master in fantasy art, from setting up your work to finishing and protecting it. THOMPSON FINE ARTS (Shop #423)

**GAMES:** You'll enjoy the history of these handcrafted games. Play them yourself, or watch. Either way you'll be thoroughly entertained. MAC GREAGOR GAMES (Shop #636-637)

**GLASSBLOWING:** Wondrous objects are created from molten glass. Watch the process unfold from the first red-hot mass until the "objet d'art" emerges from the annealing oven. YE KING'S GLASS (Shop #A1810), SASGLAMERIC (Shop #1233-A), OULU GLASS (Shop #447)

**GLASS ETCHING:** The fascinating technique of etching beautiful designs on crystal is demonstrated here for your pleasure. GARDENGLASS ART (Shop #825-826)
