## general information

### LOST AND FOUND

Drop off any lost and found items at the #300 Information Booth, or after 7:00 p.m. at Gate-B.

To locate something you have lost, contact the Festival office, Monday-Friday.

### IMPORTANT NOTICES

- Tent camping in the parking lot areas is prohibited. Many people have camped in the edge of the woods on the west side of the parking lot. This is in violation of Minnesota State Health Dept. Regulations.
- Cars in the campground without orange vehicle tags will be towed at the owner's expense. Any cars double-parked will be towed. This policy is the same as last year. We need the space for camping.
- No one is permitted in the quarry area at any time.
- Use of electric other than for construction requires a registration tag and \$15.00 per week. Safety Services can assist you with contacting the appropriate staff.

### EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

We hope that serious emergencies don't arise, but if they do, we all need to know what to do. Here are some guidelines to cover situations that could arise:

In the event of a life threatening situation:

1. Call 911 from a pay phone. No coin is needed.
2. Wait at the phone for the police to arrive.
3. Contact Safety Services - evenings BLT & Campground have radios to contact Safety Services.

If a problem occurs during show, contact Safety Services. They are the folks in the red and yellow costumes carrying a large pole topped with a flag. They have radio contact with paramedics and police and can also assist you with less serious problems. They are headquartered out of the building that is attached to the First Aid Station.

In the event that a major disaster occurs, we may need to evacuate everyone from the site. You will need to help direct people to the nearest way out. Safety Services will be directing and coordinating crowd control. Please assist them if called upon to do so.

### FROM: SAFETY SERVICES DIRECTOR TO: ONE AND ALL

Starting this weekend, anyone who does not have a valid pass to show at the Hwy. 41 check point will be requested to leave the vehicle before it is permitted to continue into the site. The person being denied admission will be allowed to enter only when someone brings a valid pass to the attendant.

All those on site who do not have properly validated Photo I.D.'s or generics, or who cannot produce a temporary one-day pass with their signature on the front, will be escorted to the Hwy. 41 check point.

If you have a Photo I.D., please have it validated for 1989. (Photo I.D.'s will be validated only at Gate B or the office during regular office hours.) If you are using a generic pass, you must check-in and have the card punched and your name entered in the Check-In Book at Gates B or C.

Checking of all I.D. passes will be conducted on a regular basis, including evening hours for these last three weekends. Be sure to have your pass with you at all times!

### INSURANCE TIP

- 1) Check your floorboards in the shop. If bad, repair. An injury to a customer will cause you to lose sales and possibly result in a lawsuit.
- 2) Check your signs. Last weekend's winds may have damaged or weakened them enough to cause them to fall. Prevention is the best insurance.

### PARTICIPANT FOOD COUPON BOOKS

Books are a \$6.00 value for only \$5.00. They are available at Gate C from 6:30 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. and Gate B from 1:30 p.m. - 6:00 p.m. Coupons are good at any food booth except beer and wine.

Books are available to all participants with a valid I.D. Each person must present their own I.D. to purchase a food book.

### MAIL, PACKAGES AND TELEPHONE MESSAGES

Mail, package and telephone message pick-up will now be at the campground through Jacques Martin. Please do not come to the office for this service. Participants are responsible for going to the campground to check for mail, packages or telephone messages.

Please remember: 1) that the Festival office is NOT responsible for ensuring delivery of mail or packages, 2) we will not be able to accept any C.O.D. packages, and they will be returned to the sender, 3) Only emergency messages will be delivered personally.

### GATE HOURS

Monday thru Thursday 7:00 a.m. - 10:30 p.m. open  
During Weekends 7:00 a.m. Friday - 2:00 a.m. Monday  
Gates Locked: 2:01 a.m. Monday - 7:00 a.m. Monday

All gates will be locked after 10:30 p.m. except back-gate near Chestnut and Hwy. 41. A-Gate and B-Gate will be locked in the evenings as soon as traffic is cleared. These hours are effective through September 24, 1989.

### CHECK-IN REMINDER

Gate C is open for check-in from 6:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Because participant parking is in that area, entertainers, games people, food independents and most craft shop workers are asked to check in there. Anyone arriving after 1:00 p.m. will not be able to use the Hwy. 41 entrance and must enter through the front gate and check in at Gate B. Please be sure this information is passed to everyone in your group.

## KING OF THE LOG

Located in the southern regions of the realm, the enjoyable pastime of two people standing on a log trunk attempting to knock one another off into the hay by swinging a pillow filled with unknown materials, calls into command a variety of skills for its participants. While strength may appear to give one bludgeoner an advantage over his or her competition, those who have made a career of this ancient art know full well that success depends more on balance, cunning, wit and a oneness with the earth; for close to earth is where many participant find themselves.

From the King of the Log bible, known to the Log People as "The Book of Pages," originally authored by Socrates while under the influence of hemlock nectar, we read: "Even the loser gets a roll in the hay!" One may conclude that in pursuit of the title of King or Queen of the Log, no one loses, everybody wins and the audience wins most.

In this day, as loyal subjects in service to the King and Queen, the noble Log People may be seen graciously imparting their wisdom to all who care to and many who need to discover the shortcut to enlightenment. At the sound of the cannon, passers-by may witness them reverently withdrawing their carefully stored bludgeons (also called bags or pillows) from Pandora's Box, humbly mounting one of their four virtuous logs, and ever-so-gently cajoling the citizens of the realm to engage in their ancient art with "A good wacking on a log!" "That's what you came to the Festival for, now let's git on with it. It'll be good for you!" "Relationship counseling, family therapy, sibling rivalry, we're licensed professionals here to help you!"

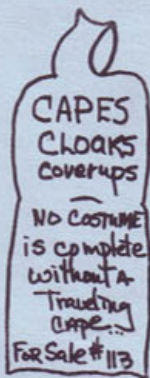

### REMINDERS

Continue to watch the 20th Century anachronisms in your shop -- conceal watches, plastic, aluminum as much as possible. And please -- no beverage cans, cigarettes or coolers in public view.

If you have customers returning to the Festival only to pick up a purchase from your shop, please direct them to come to Gate B. They may leave the \$10.95 admission fee as a deposit. They will then be given a temporary pass and may enter the site through the participant "Gate B" entrance. Depending on the location of the shop and the size of the crowd, they are expected to complete the errand and turn in the temporary pass at Gate B within 30 - 45 minutes. The \$10.95 deposit will then be refunded. If they stay for several hours, no refund will be made. They will be given a one-day "Guest Pass" to enjoy the Festival for the rest of the day.

We again remind all craft leaseholders that your presence at this show is an important part of your contract with us. If you find it necessary to be away for a day or two, you are required to inform us in writing of the exact dates and the names and qualifications of the persons who will be tending your shop in your absence. We will send warning letters for violations of the "Rules & Regs," and we know you'd rather not be the recipient of one of those! If you have questions, ask your monitor, or Linne, or Lois.

Have you ever walked by a cottonwood tree and heard a tiny figure scream to get out of the wood? Master carver Doug Hicks does. And just to prove to himself and the rest of the world that he's not crazy, he makes letting those figures out of the wood his craft.

Doug has been involved in and exhibiting at the Minnesota Festival for about 9 years. He got involved when a friend of his decided to sell his shop.

He'd been exhibiting at some art shows and decided this would be another opportunity to share his artwork. He bought the shop, and has been selling and demonstrating the process of making his cottonwood carvings at the Festival ever since. He received Master status in 1986.

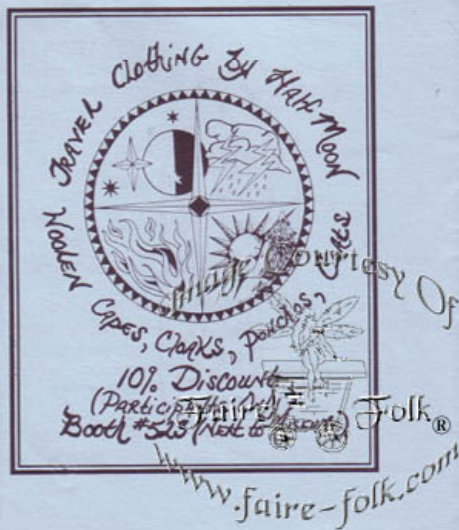

### DUELING BUCKETS

The game that we know as "Dueling Buckets" is a refinement of an ancient game first played by Egyptian nobility. Two opposing Egyptian nobles, each accompanied by a slave holding a clay pot full of sand, would stand fifteen feet apart and hurl stones at each other's slaves. When a slave was hit (assuming he survived the impact), he would yelp in surprise, throwing the clay pot up in the air and dousing both he and his master with sand.

The game was discovered by a group of crusaders led by Sir Giles the Insoluble, Baron of Waterford. They brought the game back to England, and added a European touch by substituting water for sand, as Sir Giles found that sand tended to collect in annoying, hard-to-reach areas of the armor. Wooden or metal targets were eventually substituted for the traditional peasant-with-a-water bucket when it was discovered that too many peasants were left too incapacitated by the game to work the fields properly.

The game soon became a favorite among both peasants and nobility. A survey taken by the King's scribe found that the favorite times to play the game were sunny days, when the water helped cool people off, and rainy days when it didn't matter whether one got wet or not.

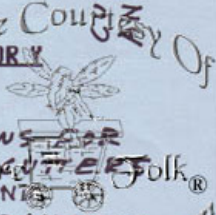
