WATCH FOR THE CHANGING TRAFFIC PATTERNS

The road from Hwy 41 is the approved participant entrance to the Festival grounds. Be aware, however, that the traffic pattern on this road and the perimeter road inside the grounds change during show hours.

From 4 pm each show day until the public parking lot is cleared, traffic is reversed. If you are entering the grounds after 4 pm, you must use the front entrance, gaining access from Hwy 169. You may then use the perimeter road to get to the participant parking lot. For your own safety, we ask that you do not attempt to enter from Hwy 41 until two-way traffic is resumed. The exact time varies with the size of the crowd and is posted before the show.

HALL OF MASTERS

All craftspeople are scheduled to exhibit in the Hall at least twice during the season. Simply drop off work for exhibit early on Saturday morning and pick up the work at the end of the weekend. The Hall staff will install the work for exhibit at no charge to you. Please make any special installation requests in advance.

No sales are made at the Hall; patrons are referred to your booth. All sales are handled directly by you. Exhibiting in the Hall gives you another chance for your work to be seen by the public. Give your work a little extra exposure and help the Hall look great!

The Hall will continue to be used to identify and evaluate the work of candidates in the Masters program, but you do not have to be involved with the Masters program to exhibit your work in the Hall.

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

We hope that serious emergencies don't arise, but if they do, we all need to know what to do. Here are some guidelines to cover situations that arise:

In the event of a life-threatening situation:

1. Call 911 from a pay phone. **NO COIN IS NEEDED.**
2. Wait at the phone for the police to arrive.
3. Contact Safety Services - evenings BLT & Campground have radios which can contact Safety Services.

If a problem occurs during the show, contact Safety Services. They are the folks in the red and yellow costumes carrying a large pole topped with a flag. They have radio contact with paramedics and police and can also assist you with less serious problems. They are headquartered out of the building that is attached to the First Aid Station.

In the event that a major disaster occurs, we may need to evacuate everyone from the site. You will need to help direct people to the nearest way out. Safety Services will be directing and coordinating crowd control. Please assist them if called.

IMPORTANT NOTICES

- Camping in the parking lot areas is prohibited. Many people have camped in the edge of the woods on the west side of the parking lot. The Minnesota State Health Department monitors closely for violations.
- Cars in the campgrounds without orange vehicle tags will be towed at the owner's expense. Any cars double-parked will be towed, starting this Friday. This policy is enforced every year. We need the space for camping.
- No one is permitted in the quarry area at any time.
- Shopowners, please do not stack piles of lumber behind or under your shops. This is mandated by the Fire Marshal.
- Use of electric other than for construction requires a registration tag and \$75.00 fee for the run of the show. Safety Services can assist you with contacting the appropriate staff.
- Please help! Take your trash and garbage to the dumpsters. It saves time and money for the site crew to make improvements on the grounds and not just maintain them. Please use your trash appropriately for recycling (including this newsletter) as per the instructions on the white containers. Thank you.

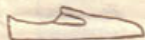

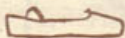

Words and pictures are taken from The Dictionary of Costume, R. Turner Wilcox, New York: Charles Scribner's Sons, 1969.

ferroni' ere - a fine chain or narrow ribbon tied around the head with a jewel suspended in the middle of the forehead. Of Oriental origin, it was a Renaissance fashion in Europe worn with the Madonna coiffure by Italian and French ladies. In the early nineteenth century, the ferroni' ere was worn by French and English ladies.

martingale - the leather strap fastened to a horse's girth, intended to hold his head down and prevent his rearing. In costume, a stay strap of partial belt to hold folds in place. On a modern coat, a belt across the back and attached at the sides to hold the fullness in place.

tuke, tewke - a canvas of the 15th and 16th centuries.

- **ALCOHOL** - Drunkenness and under-age drinking will not be tolerated.
- **AREA MANAGERS** - Take your problems and questions to these "characters on the beat" - Stephanie Delk, Marilyn Hagerman, Kerry Kerl, Willie Lauder, Brian Murphy, Jason Parker, Brad Peterson, Tim Wick.
- **CAST CALL** - 8:00 a.m. every show day at Bakery Stage. The best way to find out what is happening. Group Leaders and Street Characters must attend.
- **DAILY PASSES** - can be picked up at C Gate before 1 p.m. on Festival days.
- **DIRECTOR NOTES** -
 - ✓ Stay in character on village streets.
 - ✓ Keep the modern world off village streets. No cigarettes, watches, modern slang, etc.
 - ✓ Learn and use village and character names.
 - ✓ Remember that the Festival is FAMILY theatre. Guard against off-color remarks, drug and drinking jokes, and personal contact (touch).
 - ✓ Be aware. Don't walk through someone's act or bit.
- **DRUGS** - Use of illegal drugs will not be tolerated.
- **DRUM JAM** - 6:30 in Overhill Meadow.
- **ENTERTAIN** - to show hospitality to; to engage the attention of; to please; to amuse.
- **ENTERTAINMENT ASSISTANT** - Terry Foy.
- **ENTERTAINMENT OFFICE** - 2nd floor of Bad Manor. There are steps to this office on the corner of Bad Manor closest to the track.
- **GATE** - Opening Gate Show at 8:30 a.m., Opening Cannon at 9:00 a.m., Closing Gate Show at 6:30 p.m., Closing Cannon at 7:00 p.m.
- **GRIDS** - Schedule of stage acts, lane acts and entertainment events for each weekend. Available at C Gate, Cast Call, Entertainment Office and Main Stages. Copies are for acts only. Acts should request schedule changes in writing by 4 p.m. on Sundays.
- **HAT PASSING** - ALL hat passing must be approved.
- **ID's** - your entertainment ID is your pass to get on or off Festival grounds. Don't leave home without it.
- **PARADE** - Grande Parade lines up at 1:15 on hill behind Bakery. All characters and groups should participate.
- **PRODUCTION STAFF MEETING** - Held daily at 2:30 in the entertainment office. All group leaders and stage managers are invited, but not required, to attend.
- **WEAPONS** - must be fully sheathed and tied into the sheath. Weapons may not be drawn. All stage combat must be seen and approved before being done before an audience.

FAIRE VALUE

An old complaint that many raise is that the Festival is too expensive. Well, recent articles concerning similar events have come out and I think it is appropriate for me to share with you what I have learned. At the State Fair, a beer will cost you \$2.00 for a 12 ounce cup and \$3.50 for a 22 ounce cup. Our beer is 14 ounces for \$1.75, ounce for ounce this makes a State Fair beer 33% more expensive. Our corn is \$1.25 - theirs \$1.50, their parking is free if you come 4 to a car, ours is simply free.

Medieval Times recently opened another unit of their Jousting Dinner Theatre in Chicago. On a weekend, an adult pays \$34 for a standard meal of raw vegetables, vegetable soup, cornish hen, ribs, baked potato and pastries and a 2 hour jousting show with a little falconry and magic as well. If that same person were to attend the Renaissance even at full general admission the total cost would only be \$29.95 and they would get more than 2 hours of entertainment.

In short, the Renaissance Festival is now an entertainment bargain. A family can enjoy a great time without spending a king's ransom. This is something we can all be proud of and something we should all be promoting.
