PARADE PARTICIPATION

The Hall of Masters invites all craftspeople interested in parade participation to meet on the hill behind the Bakery Stage. Enter the gate between Bakery Stage and Banner Oak Pottery about 1:15 pm. A Hall Staff person will be there with the Master of the Hall banner to lead the group - please bring your sign, a sample of your work, or a banner and walk along the parade route.

The parade starts with the cannon at 1:30. The trumpeters lead the parade, followed by Royalty, the court, and the Mayor's Entourage. A craft section follows, led by the Master of the Hall banner. Then Como Zoo animals, various entertainers and finally the elephant.

As people are finding their groups to line up prior to the parade, please look for the Master of the Hall banner so we can let our presence be known to all in the Realm!

WATCH FOR THE CHANGING TRAFFIC PATTERNS

The road from Hwy 41 is the approved pursonnel entrance to the Festival grounds. Be aware, however, that the traffic pattern on this road and the permeter road inside the grounds change during show hours.

From 4 pm each show day until the public parking lot is cleared, traffic is exit only. If you are entering the grounds after 4 pm, you must use the front entrance, gaining access from Hwy 169. You may then use the perimeter road to get to the participant parking lot. For your own safety, we ask that you do not attempt to enter from Hwy 41 until two way traffic is resumed. The exact time varies with the size of the crowd, but never before 7:30 pm.

HALL OF MASTERS

All craftspeople are scheduled to exhibit in the Hall at least twice during the season. Simply drop off work for exhibit early on Saturday morning and pick up the work at the end of the weekend. The Hall staff will install the work for exhibit at no charge to you. Please make any special installation requests in advance.

No sales are made at the Hall; patrons are referred to your booth. All sales are handled directly by you. Exhibiting in the Hall gives you another chance for your work to be seen by the public. Give your work a little extra exposure and help the Hall look great!

The Hall will continue to be used to identify and evaluate the work of candidates in the Masters program, but you do not have to be involved with the Masters program to exhibit your work in the Hall.

RECORDS FALL

The State Fair finished with no new records of total attendance. On the other hand, the Festival set two new attendance records.

Saturday was the largest ever crowd for that day of the event—22,865 attended. The previous high was 21,362. Labor Day weekend as a cumulative total also set a record. After 3 days, the total was 67,507; 2,015 better than the previous high set in 1986.



Our total attendance now stands at 137,255 or a daily average of 19,607. That pace projects to a total gate of 294,117. We all know, however, that September brings out the largest crowds so I'm confident that we will do better than average.

Keep up the good work and let's set even more records.

IMPORTANT NOTICES

- Camping in the parking lot areas is prohibited. Many people have camped in the edge

COSTUME DICTIONARY

Words and pictures are taken from The Dictionary of Costume, R. Turner Wilcox, New York: Charles Scribner's Sons, 1969.

ermine - smallest of weasels with cold weather coat of pure white, summer coat of pale brown and tip of tail always black. Fur used to trim royal and legal robes and for hearladic insignia.

garland - a headband or fillet, usually of wool, worn by priests in Greek and Roman antiquity.

Medici collar - shaped like the falling band, but pleated and wired, rising from a low decolletage and standing high in back. Originating in Italy, it was worn by the Medici women, including Queen Marie of France (1573-1642).

panes - a feature of men's & women's dress during the Renaissance. The old decoration consisted of panes or squares and slits cut into a costume, permitting a silk lining of contrasting color to show through. It was taken up all over Europe, a fashion lasting into the 1530's.

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

- "Where's Jamie's booth?"


This is Sir Cumference's favorite:
