ATTENDANCE REMINDER

One of the outstanding features of the craft program at the Minnesota Renaissance Festival is the opportunity for customers to meet the artist in person. It brings about a better understanding and appreciation of the work and ultimately leads to increased sales. We remind all craft licensees that your presence at this show is an important part of your contract with us.

If you find it necessary to be away for a day or two, you are required to inform us in writing of the exact dates and the names and qualifications of the persons who will be tending your shop in your absence.

Warning letters are issued for violations of the "Rules & Regs" and we know you'd rather not receive one of those! We understand problems and emergencies; we don't like to create them.

RETURN CUSTOMERS

If you have customers returning to the Festival only to pick up a purchase from your shop, direct them to Gate B. They may leave the \$11.95 admission fee as a deposit. They will then be given a temporary pass and may enter the site through the participant Gate B entrance.

Depending on the location of the shop and the size of the crowd, they are expected to complete the errand and turn in the temporary pass at Gate B within 30-45 minutes. The \$11.95 will then be refunded. If they stay several hours, no refund will be made. Please be aware of this policy.

DROP OFF: Registration forms are available from monitors or at the Hall. The completed form is to be left with your piece when you drop it off on **Saturday mornings between 7:00 a.m. and 8:30 a.m.** Sign in on the roster and that's it!

PICK UP: Sign out on the roster and pick up your work between 7:00 p.m. and 7:45 p.m. on the last day of the weekend (Sundays or Labor Day).

Submit works only as featured each weekend. **IT IS IMPORTANT THAT YOUR WORK IS RECEIVED EARLY TO ALLOW TIME FOR INSTALLATION!**

There are many pieces of artwork at the Hall of Masters from previous exhibits that have not been picked up. Please pick all unclaimed pieces up this weekend after noon Saturday or before 7:00pm Sunday. We ask that you not come for pick-up of previous weeks exhibits during installation or pick-up of current week's show as these items are stored separately and all staff are needed to process the current show so exhibitors can return to their booths as quickly as possible. Remember your work is insured from Saturday a.m. drop off until Sunday 8:00 p.m. of the exhibit weekend only.

1992 CRAFT SPACE DEPOSIT REMINDER

As in the past, you are required to make a deposit to reserve your craft space for next year, whether the space you occupy is a shop, tent or unstructured space. Deposits will be accepted at Gate B next weekend and closing weekend.

We will also be accepting prepayment of your 1992 fee which offers a 5% discount.

MASTERS PROGRAM

The Masters Program is a voluntary program whose purpose is to honor and encourage excellence in the crafts by setting artistic standards, promoting public appreciation of high quality crafts, and opportunities for exchange among colleagues. The program is unusual in the crafts community in general although some states have craft organizations that provide a slide registry or recommendation system which serves similar purposes. Among themed events, the Masters Program at the Minnesota Renaissance Festival is unique and is one of the factors that make this Festival one of the best.

All craftspeople are eligible for nomination to the Program. This year's nominations are due after this issue's press deadline, but a full list will be available by next week's issue. At the Hall of Masters, nominee's work on display will be especially labeled.

About 10% of the Festival's craftspeople have been awarded the status of Master, and about 20% the status of Artisan. As the review and evaluation process continues the rest of the season, take a moment to notice the work of the nominees.

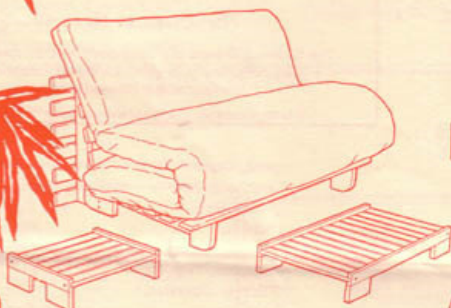

This weekend the Festival extends a welcoming hand to hearing-impaired visitors, with ASL interpreters signing at many entertainment stages, craft demos, etc. Sir Roger McNear, Master of Leather, takes the opportunity to extend the welcoming hand from his craft shop. Roger invites a friend to interpret in his shop for any customers who visit over the weekend. Sir Roger, who's booth is ramped on all sides, provides a copy of his catalog in Braille. WATCH FOR THE CHANGING TRAFFIC PATTERNS

The road from Hwy 41 is the approved participant entrance to the Festival grounds. Be aware, however, that the traffic pattern on this road and the perimeter road inside the grounds change during show hours.

From 4 pm each show day until the public parking lot is cleared, traffic is exit only. If you are entering the grounds after 4 pm, you must use the front entrance, gaining access from Hwy 169. You may then use the perimeter road to get to the participant parking lot. For your own safety, we ask that you do not attempt to enter from Hwy 41 until two way traffic is resumed. The exact time varies with the size of the crowd, but never before 7:30 pm.
